# Water Cost of Capital Application (A.23-05-004)

# November 9, 2023

#### What Is This Application About?

Every three years, the California Public Utilities Commission



(CPUC) requires Liberty Utilities Park Water (Park) and Liberty Utilities Apple Valley Ranchos Water (Apple Valley) to file a Cost of Capital (CoC) application. Pursuant to this requirement, on May 1, 2023 Park and Apple Valley filed the joint Application (A.) 23-05-004 requesting an increase in revenues for the period from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

This CoC application allows the CPUC to take a broad, in-depth look at a utility's proposed financing capital structure and authorize a reasonable Rate of Return (ROR) to enable the utility to attract investors for infrastructure improvements. The ROR consist of the weighted average cost of debt and equity a utility has issued to finance its capital investments.

Under Park and Apple Valley's request, an average residential customer for Park with a 5/8-inch meter using 9 CCF (1 CCF = 748 gallons) would see a bill increase from \$80.42 currently to \$85.90 per month. That is an increase of \$5.48 or 6.8%. An average residential customer for Apple Valley with a 5/8-inch meter using 12 CCF (1 CCF = 748 gallons) would see a bill increase from \$80.41 currently to \$87.53 per month. That is an increase of \$7.12 or 8.9%.

Park and Apple Valley have no other pending applications before the CPUC.
