Dear Ms. Marona:

On January 19, 2011, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) submitted a Notice of Proposed Construction to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking authority to begin construction of the Fogarty Substation segment of the Valley-Ivyglen Subtransmission Line and Fogarty Substation project in Southwestern Riverside County. A Final Environmental Impact Report (SCH # 2008011082) for the project was published in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act by the CPUC in May 2010. On August 12, 2010, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity was granted by the CPUC under Decision 10-08-009.

Notice To Proceed #1 is granted by the CPUC for the proposed undertaking based on the following conditions:

- All construction will be carried out in accordance with the standards, requirements, and protocols of the Final EIR and the Fogarty Substation Project, Mitigation Monitoring, and Reporting Program dated January 2011;
- Staging and storage of all equipment, building materials, machinery, and other construction supplies for the Fogarty Substation project shall be confined to the substation perimeter as described in the FEIR;
- Copies of all relevant permits, compliance plans (i.e. MMCRP, SWPPP, etc.), and this Notice to Proceed shall be available on-site for the duration of construction activities. Copies of permits shall be provided to the CPUC upon request.
- All crew personnel shall be appropriately trained on environmental issues, including requirements of the MMCRP, prior to starting work on the project site. A log shall be maintained on-site with the names of all crew personnel trained and submitted to the CPUC on a monthly basis.

- SCE shall comply with all applicable mitigation measures for Fogarty Substation project while conducting concurrent construction activities.
