
Dear Ms. Orsaba:

Thank you for your letter dated August 2, 2016. PG&E has submitted certain project materials to the CPUC confidentially under California Public Utilities Code Section 583. Your letter indicates that the CPUC requires public disclosure of all of these records except those that may represent a security risk or are otherwise protected by law in order to prepare an adequately-supported environmental document pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA").

Because you have indicated that these materials are necessary for CEQA review, PG&E agrees to withdraw its prior claim of confidentiality under Section 583. We understand that you will retain the confidentiality of those documents submitted under Section 583 and not listed in your letter of August 2, 2016, as well as those parts of the previously-designated cultural and paleontological materials that are confidential under other laws.

I am also confirming that the GIS data links previously provided confidentially by PG&E may be used to create PDF maps for public review.
