Background

On January 28, 2016, the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) adopted a successor tariff to the current net energy metering (NEM) tariff in [Decision 16-01-044](#). That decision directed Energy Division staff, in collaboration with R.14-07-002 parties, to undertake further consideration of consumer protection measures, including the development of an information packet for customers interested in taking service under the NEM successor tariff.

Purpose

As a first step in the Commission's further consideration of these issues, the purpose of this workshop will be to identify:

1. Consumer protection issues NEM customers have encountered; and
2. Existing regulation and jurisdiction over consumer protection for NEM customers.
