## CTF Background Karo Serlé

#### California Teleconnect Fund Goals and Objectives:

- Advance universal service by providing discounted rates to qualifying schools, maintaining pre-school, kindergarten or any of the grades 1 to 12, inclusive, community colleges, libraries, hospitals, health clinics and community organizations;
- 2) Bring every Californian direct access to advanced communications services in their local communities;
- 3) Ensure high-speed internet connectivity for community CTF-eligible institutions at reasonable rates; and
- 4) Increase direct access to high-speed internet in communities with lower rates of internet adoption and greater financial need.

The California Teleconnect Fund (CTF) provides discounts of 50% for advanced telecommunications services to help bridge the "digital divide" to the following entities:

Schools
Libraries
Community Colleges
Government Owned and Operated Health Facilities
Community Based Organizations (CBOs)
Healthcare Community Based Organizations
California Telehealth Network (CTN)

The CTF Program is funded by ratepayer surcharges on telephone access lines. Currently the surcharge rate is \$0.25 per access line. The appropriated CTF budget for 2024-2025 is \$108.58 million.



#### CTF for Schools and Libraries

## Special Services for Schools and Libraries

- ❖ Discounts of 50% for eligible k-12 Public, Charter and Private schools.
- Discounts of 50% for eligible Libraries.
- Distance Learning Discount Program.
- Broadband Internet Access.
- ❖ E-Rate match.





## CTF Eligibility Criteria for Schools and Libraries Donighi (Bubba) Siamack

## **School Eligibility**

- California address with active County-District-School (CDS) code.
- ❖ Must provide K-12 or preschool curriculum that meet E-Rate eligibility.
- Private schools must have annual endowments below \$50 million.
- Annexes must have a Billed Entity Number linked with a school with a valid CDS code.



## **Library Eligibility**

- Letter from the State Librarian stating they are a library.
- Book mobiles also need to provide a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and license plate number.

### **Libraries And The CTF Myth**

 My Library is only eligible for CTF if it participates in the Federal E-Rate program.





#### **Libraries And The CTF Myth**

- Federal E-Rate and State CTF programs are separate programs.
- E-Rate Participation is higher than CTF Participation



#### **Libraries and Annexes**

 A point of service maintained outside of an administrative entity or branch library that provides Internet connectivity and has electronic equipment or other material physically available to provide access to library resources including the library catalog or patron accounts.


