

# California Advanced Services Fund

The CASF program is one of the six Public Purpose Programs. Pub. Util. Code Section 281 (a) directs the CPUC to develop, implement, and administer the CASF program to encourage deployment of high-quality advanced communications services to all Californians.

## Broadband Adoption Account

**\$78 MILLION AWARDED**

Awarded 672 digital inclusion and broadband access projects serving 469,219 participants in all counties of California.

## Public Housing Account

**\$22 MILLION AWARDED FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND ADOPTION PROJECTS**

Awarded 565 projects, connecting 27,292 low income households across 35 counties.

## Infrastructure, Loan, and Line-Extension Account

**\$346.7 MILLION AWARDED**

Awarded 103 projects (4 Line Extension Program & 1 Infrastructure Loan) of which 93 last-mile/hybrid projects provide broadband access to 66,639 estimated potential households. The overall total number of potential households served when including middle-mile projects is 322,931.

## Rural and Regional Urban Consortia Account

**\$29.1 MILLION AWARDED**

Awarded 62 projects to support regional broadband consortia that help facilitate CASF infrastructure applications and assist with broadband deployment under programs created by SB 156 and AB 164. On November 20, 2025, the Commission adopted Decision 25-11-003 to expand the program to include Tribal Consortia and activities related to the federal Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program.

## Tribal Technical Assistance

**\$9.5 MILLION AWARDED**

Awarded 83 projects for 43 Tribes to provide technical assistance in developing studies, plans, grant writing, funding consultant services, and Tribal staff hours, to support Tribes in their pursuit of improved voice and broadband communications.
