SUBJECT: CALIFORNIA ADVANCED SERVICES FUND (CASF) – DENIAL OF THE PROPOSED INYO NETWORKS INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE SOUTH INYO BROADBAND PROJECT

Dear Mr.Volker:

Thank you for your May 22, 2015, CASF infrastructure grant application to serve the four communities of Cartago, Olancha, Keeler, and Darwin in the southern part of Inyo County. The application references broadband availability data as of June 30, 2014 and asserts that the proposed project areas are unserved. Communications Division (CD) staff reviewed the proposed project in light of recently published broadband availability data as of December 31, 2014 showing that Lone Pine Television (LPTV) offers broadband Internet access at served speeds in Cartago, Olancha, and Keeler.

As you are aware, LPTV offers fixed wireless Internet access in portions of the proposed project area.¹ In response to the application's assertion that LPTV's actual service level is unserved or potentially underserved, CD staff requested LPTV conduct tests of their fixed wireless service at subscriber locations using CalSPEED. The test results demonstrated that LPTV's infrastructure can provide service of at least 6 Megabits per second (Mbps) download and 1.5 Mbps upload in Cartago, Olancha, and Keeler.²

Based on our evaluation, CD staff finds that LPTV serves Cartago, Olancha, and Keeler and therefore the South Inyo Broadband project is ineligible for CASF funding. The CASF program does not allow grants to fund projects where broadband infrastructure capabilities at served speeds already exist. Inyo Networks may resubmit an application for the unserved area of Darwin or other eligible areas at any time while the current application window is open. All applications will be evaluated according to the CASF scoring criteria and requirements set forth in Public Utilities Code section 281.

CD staff recently received tower location data and antenna parameters from LPTV, which it used to propagate the fixed wireless coverage area shown in the map below (Appendix A). LPTV also submitted confidential subscriber street address information to demonstrate the extent of their subscriber locations. CD will update the California Interactive Broadband Availability Map to reflect Internet service with fixed wireless coverage at served speeds in Cartago, Olancha, and Keeler.³
