Background:

In September 2019, the Commission opened this Order Instituting Rulemaking (OIR) to facilitate the commercialization of microgrids and adopt resiliency strategies pursuant to Senate Bill (SB) 1339. SB 1339 requires the Commission, in consultation with the California Energy Commission and the California Independent Service Operator, to take action to facilitate the commercialization of microgrids for distribution customers of large electrical corporations.

Components of microgrid commercialization are set by SB 1339, and must include: (1) rates, tariffs, and rules, as necessary; that (2) remove barriers for deploying microgrids across the large investorowned utility (IOU) service territories; (3) without shifting costs onto non-benefiting customers; and (4) prioritizing and ensuring worker, public, and the electric system's safety and reliability.

Track 5 of this proceeding is focused on developing a multi-property microgrid tariff. Parties have been given an opportunity to submit proposals for multi-property microgrid tariffs that follow the

guiding principles and requirements established by Administrative Law Judge rulings on August 8, 2023¹, and October 23, 2023².

Purpose of the Workshop:

The purpose of this workshop is to allow parties to present their proposals for a multi-property microgrid tariff, previously filed into the record of R.19-09-009, and to allow for questions and public comments.
