FOR PERIOD JULY THROUGH DECEMBER 2020

Background

Southern California Edison Company (“SCE”) hereby submits its first semi-annual report in accordance with Resolution E-4999 (“Resolution”), issued June 3, 2019¹.

Ordering Paragraph (“OP”) 1(g) states:

“Once an IOU has completed its first RFO or initiated customer enrollment, whichever occurs first, semi-annually, within 30 Calendar Days after the end of the second quarter of the year and the fourth quarter of the year, PG&E, SCE, and SDG&E shall report to Energy Division Central Files the number of income-qualified customers subscribed to each CSGT project and the capacity allocated to those customers, whether a waitlist of non-income-qualified customers exists and the size of that list, and if project sponsors are receiving bill credits under CSGT projects, the size of each sponsor’s subscription. In these semi-annual reports PG&E, SCE, and SDG&E shall also include the number of master-metered accounts participating in the CSGT program, and the total program capacity allocated to those master-metered accounts.”²

Decision 18-06-027 (“Decision”) also specifies that utilities work with the Energy Division (“ED”) on reporting requirements and that the ED may modify such requirements as necessary.³ As specific reporting requirements were not designated in the Decision, the Resolution provides standardized reporting requirements to participating investor-owned utilities (“IOUs”) that include a semi-annual Disadvantaged Communities Green Tariff (“DAC-GT”) and Community Solar Green Tariff (“CSGT”) programs progress report with enrollment, waitlist and subscription details by the program.⁴

This filing is the semi-annual report described in the Resolution. Since SCE completed its earliest RFO in October 2020, this semi-annual report covers July through December 2020.

Semi-Annual Report for The CSGT Program

Pursuant to Decision 18-06-027 (“Decision”) and in accordance with Resolution E-4999, Southern California Edison Company (“SCE”) files its first semi-annual report on the Community Solar Green Tariff (“CSGT”) program for the period July - December 2020.

SCE’s CSGT program (also known as “Local Green Saver”) has a program capacity allocation of 14.63 megawatts (MW) and provides a 20% electric bill discount to low-income and non-low-income customers who are located within an eligible census tract and a specified distance from the community solar project built under the program.

On February 27, 2020, SCE launched its first CSGT solicitation and procured one (1) project – Visalia CSG. The Energy Division approved the project in October. SCE then began accepting subscription and waitlist requests on October 26, 2020, for both income-qualified and non-income qualified customers. This project is estimated to begin delivery first quarter 2022.

As of December 31, 2020, there were no income and non-income qualified customers subscribed or on the waitlist. Table 1 summarizes the participation level, which includes the number of income-qualified customers subscribed and the total subscribed capacity of those customers, whether a waitlist of non-income qualified customers exists or not and if so, how many customers are on that waitlist if sponsor(s) are receiving bill credits what their subscription capacity, and the number of master-metered accounts participating and the total capacity allocated to those master-metered accounts.

It is important to note that for this report, “Number of Customers Subscribed” is defined as customers who are actively enrolled in a CSGT program. Customers who are on the waitlist are not counted towards the CSGT program subscription.

Sponsors may be eligible to subscribe to up to 25% of a CSGT project once the income-qualified participation threshold of 50% has been met. At this time, the Visalia CSG project has not met the sponsor participation threshold, and as a result, the sponsor(s) have not begun subscription activities including specification of the percentage of the system's capacity that they wish to subscribe. Additionally, the sponsor(s) have not started to receive bill credits, given that the project is not yet online.

For this reporting period, master-metered customers were not eligible to participate in the CSGT program because 50% of the Visalia CSG project's capacity has not been subscribed to low-income customers as required by the CSGT program.
