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CPUC Propelling Energy Market Transformation

Vou may have heard the term Energy Market Transformation, but what does it really mean? In a nutshell, it is the process of intervening in a market to create lasting change by removing barriers and accelerating the adoption of innovative technologies or practices. The results mean faster progress on California's climate and clean energy goals. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) aims to integrate new energy market transformation initiatives in ways that will be selfsustaining and ultimately yield measurable benefits that will remain long after the processes have been implemented. Most importantly, these new initiatives will also support the CPUC and California's goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, create workforce development opportunities, and foster equity in all of the state's diverse cities and communities.



On January 31, 2023, the CPUC announced that it had selected its first-ever Market Transformation Administrator (CalMTA) to help propel energy efficiency transformation through leading-edge initiatives that will also bring sustainable, costeffective market changes to California. Resource Innovations, a clean energy services provider owned and managed by leading women in the energy field, was selected as the CalMTA. Resource Innovations will partner with a team of experts in program development, evaluation, and equity inclusion.

The CalMTA's work includes soliciting ideas from the market; growing ideas internally; developing and applying selection criteria for initiatives; consulting with and reporting to a Market Transition Administrator Board comprised of industry experts and the CPUC; and issuing public reports on selection outcomes.

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Outdoor Experience Learning Opportunities for People of All Ages

n continued efforts to impact land conservation throughout California, the CPUC achieved a legacy of long-term land preservation efforts through a 2003 settlement agreement with Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E). The agreement required PG&E to create the <u>Pacific Forest and</u> <u>Watershed Lands Stewardship Council</u>, with funding of \$30 million dedicated to youth educational programs and \$70 million for land planning and enhancements, known as the Land Conservation Commitment. As a result, the CPUC successfully facilitated a unique productive partnership in California that paired land resources with proactive educational outreach and conservation efforts that benefit current and future generations.

In June 2019, 62 acres of pristine wilderness land was donated by PG&E to the San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE). This land donation enabled SJCOE to create a learning hub for its students and area residents called the Sky Mountain Educational Center.

The 62 acres of land in Placer County (just south of Lake Valley Reservoir) are now protected in perpetuity with a land conservation easement that will benefit California residents while also providing:



- Outdoor recreation such as hiking, fishing, nature study, environmental education, and sightseeing.
- Natural habitats for fish, wildlife, and plants that includes species protected under the California and/or Federal Endangered Species Act.
- Sustainable forestry that maintains forest resources on the property consisting of Sierra mixed conifer.
- Land in keeping with the surrounding environment that provides contiguous forested landscape visible to passersby on the nearby roads and highways.

In addition to the land donation from PG&E, the Stewardship Council allocated funding to facilitate physical renovations and improvements to bring the Sky Mountain Educational Center up to current State codes so SJCOE can move forward with using it as an educational facility for children. Today, the Sky Mountain Educational Center offers students of all ages a rare opportunity to experience the outdoors and its respective unique ecosystems through hands-on outdoor learning programs. There are classrooms in the forests, on the water's edge, and inside of a snowbank.

The Stewardship Council has nearly completed the Land Conservation Commitment planning process and will cease operations soon. The Sierra Nevada Conservancy (a California State Agency) was appointed by the CPUC to administer the remaining Land Conservation Commitment funds following dissolution of the Stewardship Council.

The success of programs like the Sky Mountain Educational Center are the result of the collaborative efforts of the CPUC and the Stewardship Council to conserve land and create access to nature for all people in California.



New Area Code Joins 530 Region

he CPUC has acted to ensure that telephone numbers continue to be available to meet the demand in the geographic region served by the 530 area code by approving a second area code (called an overlay) that will provide additional numbering resources while minimizing customer inconvenience. The new area code to overlay the 530 area codes is 837.

The <u>530 area code</u> is projected to run out of available prefixes (the first three numbers after the area code in a telephone number) during the third quarter of 2025. The CPUC approved the request of the North American Numbering Plan Administrator, the neutral third-party area code relief planner for California, for an area code overlay. No existing customers will be required to change their area code or specific telephone number. The new overlay area code of 837 will be available for new telephone number assignments in the same region as the 530 area code upon exhaust of available prefixes in the existing 530 area code.

The 530 area code covers most of the northeastern portion of California, including all or portions of Alpine, Butte, Colusa, El Dorado, Glenn, Humboldt, Lassen, Modoc, Mono,

Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Solano, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Yolo, and Yuba counties. It serves cities and communities including but not limited to Chico, Davis, El Dorado Hills, Oroville, Paradise, Placerville, Red Bluff, Redding, South Lake Tahoe, Truckee, Woodland, and Yuba City, as well as unincorporated areas.

An area code overlay adds an additional area code to the geographic region served by the existing area code(s). Therefore, multiple area codes co-exist within the same geographic region. Existing 530/837 customers will retain their area code and specific telephone number(s). Customers will continue to dial the three-digit area code for all calls to and from telephone numbers with the 530 and 837 area codes. The price of a call will not change due to the overlay. Customers can still dial just three digits to reach 911, as well as 211, 311, 411, 511, 611, 711, and 811.

The 530 area code was formed in 1997 when the CPUC approved an area code split of the 916 area code, introducing the 530 area code.

Have An Idea?

CalMTA is seeking ideas that will accelerate market adoption of a new or under-used energy efficiency technology or practice through a Request for Ideas (RFI) that opened on June 15, 2023 and will run through August 18, 2023. Those with an idea can submit through the newly launched <u>Idea</u> <u>Portal</u>. If the idea is selected to advance, the CalMTA will develop a plan for implementation and conduct a competitive solicitation of bids for its delivery. The CPUC will review and approve the market transformation plans that result from this process. Decisions are made based on forecasts and research and can include business case studies, market characterization studies, industry expertise, and risk analysis.

The development and implementation of a full portfolio of Market Transformation initiatives is expected to require several years of work, ongoing evaluation, and stakeholder engagement. This will serve to illustrate how the portfolio of Market Transformation initiatives is creating lasting energy



savings and impacting California's climate goals by reducing greenhouse gas emissions, advancing workforce development, and increasing equity inclusion.
