Restoring Ancestral Bonds: The CPUC's Commitment to Environmental and Social Justice and Tribal Legacy in California

The CPUC exemplifies a trailblazing commitment to environmental and social justice, particularly in its robust support for tribal communities and land conservation throughout California.

The CPUC has achieved a legacy of dedicated, long-term land preservation efforts through its <u>Settlement Agreement</u> with Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) in the utility's bankruptcy case. This groundbreaking agreement not only required PG&E to create the Pacific Forest and Watershed


Stewardship Council (Stewardship Council) but also allocated \$100 million of ratepayer funds to the initiative. Of this, \$70 million was designated for land planning and enhancements, known as the Land Conservation Commitment (LCC), and \$30 million was dedicated to youth educational programs.

A defining moment in these endeavors came with the momentous restitution of more than 2,300 acres of ancestral lands to the Mountain Maidu people, restoring their connection to

Humbug Valley, or <u>Tásmam Kojóm</u>. This landmark achievement not only highlighted the CPUC's deeprooted dedication to conscientious land stewardship and preservation but also echoed a broader vision of its <u>Environmental and Social Justice Action Plan</u>.

One of the most compelling aspects of the Mountain Maidu community's land restitution is the potential it holds for the future. The Maidu Summit

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CPUC Initiates New Proceeding to Enhance

Grid Reliability in California

The CPUC has opened a new proceeding to continue efforts to ensure the availability of reliable and cost-effective electricity supply in California through implementation and administration of its Resource Adequacy program.

The preliminary scope of issues for the new proceeding includes:

- The adoption of Local and Flexible capacity procurement requirements for the years 2025-2028, targeting entities that provide power to the grid.
- Evaluation of potential adjustments to the recently introduced 24-hour Slice-of-Day planning framework. This framework is designed to ensure grid reliability during each hour of the peak load day every month; 2024 serves as a test year for Slice-of-Day, allowing stakeholders to assess the effectiveness of newly developed filing tools before full implementation.
- Consideration of modifications to the Resource Adequacy penalty structure and other incentives to encourage compliance with program requirements.
- Coordination with <u>Integrated Resource Plan</u> activities, including determining appropriate Planning Reserve Margin requirements for short-term planning as compared to the longer considerations in the Integrated Resource Plan proceeding.



- Exploration of changes in the counting methods for Qualifying Capacity, including those for Demand Response resources.
- Examination of other potential adjustments to the Resource Adequacy program that may be proposed by stakeholders.

Resource Adequacy serves as the platform where the CPUC ensures the secure and reliable real-time operation of the electric grid, ensuring the availability of adequate resources for the California Independent System Operator when and where they are needed.

Mark Your Calendar for Public Forums on SDG&E's Rate Design Request

The CPUC will hold in-person and virtual public forums for customers of San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) to provide input into the company's proposal to allocate previously approved electric costs among customers (e.g., residential, commercial, industrial) through electric rates.

WHEN: Nov. 6, 2023: 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. (in-person only) Nov. 20, 2023: 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. (virtual only)

The public forums will begin with a brief overview of SDG&E's electric rate design proposals, then parties to the proceeding may provide brief overviews, and then public comments will be heard. At least one representative from SDG&E will be available to answer questions about individual customer bills or service.



Background

On January 17, 2023, SDG&E submitted its General Rate Case (GRC) Phase 2 Application to the CPUC seeking approval to allocate the costs that were approved in Phase 1 of the GRC. A GRC Phase 2 primarily focuses on modifying rate structures and the allocation of revenue among customer classes (e.g., residential, commercial, industrial). According to SDG&E, the requested rate adjustments include:



- Extending the weekday Super Off-Peak Time-of-Use period, the period of the day when SDG&E's Time-of-Use rates are the lowest, to include additional hours from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. year-round;
- Introducing a new rate class for medium-sized commercial customers providing rates that are more aligned with these customers' cost of service; and,
- Adopting rates that better reflect the cost of providing service for customers, among other rate design changes. (SDG&E's application does not propose any alterations to SDG&E's previously authorized electric revenues and makes no requests for changes to natural gas rates.)

SDG&E's proposal would decrease average residential rates by 0.3 percent, decrease average small commercial rates by 0.2 percent, decrease average large commercial and industrial rates by 1.1 percent, and increase average agricultural customer rates by 1.3 percent.

The CPUC welcomes attendance and comments at the public forums (formally called Public Participation Hearings), as public comments help the CPUC reach an informed decision. The Administrative Law Judge assigned to the proceeding is scheduled to issue a Proposed Decision in the case for consideration by the CPUC within a year.

Consortium (MSC) vision includes transforming Tásmam Kojóm into California's first Native American tribal cultural park. Their plans include harmonizing public recreation with education about tribal culture and history, offering guided tours, camping opportunities, basket-weaving instruction, and Maidu language restoration programs. All of these initiatives aim to enrich visitors' understanding and appreciation of the Maidu people's heritage.

"In the restitution of Tásmam Kojóm, we witness more than a return of land. We see the revival of an ancestral bond that breathes life into the landscape. This is environmental justice in action, a pledge by the CPUC to not just conserve nature but to restore the spirit of cultures cradled in these forests and valleys," said Kenneth C. Holbrook, Tribal Advisor at the CPUC. "As we move forward, let every step echo with the respect for those who have walked these paths before us and the resolve to protect the sacred symphony of life and legacy in California's wilderness."

Key partners in this endeavor include the Feather River Land Trust and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, who hold the conservation easement and collaborate with the Maidu on land management strategies. These strategies encompass fish and wildlife management, benefitting the area's flora and fauna as well.

The profound impact of this initiative extends beyond the Maidu community; it is a beacon of hope and a model for future cooperative land management between tribal groups and state entities. It highlights the CPUC's commitment to a multifaceted approach to land stewardship that honors the past, enriches the present, and safeguards the future. Ultimately, this CPUC initiative is a testament to the power of collaborative stewardship and serves as a reminder that when we respect the land and the heritage it sustains, we contribute to a richer, more inclusive future for all Californians.
