The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will hold Evidentiary Hearings at the time and place noted above to review San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E®) request for authority to establish a rate to serve electric vehicle (EV) direct current fast charging and medium-duty and heavy-duty charging.

Please note: The CPUC's Courtroom is wheelchair accessible. If you wish to attend and need specialized accommodations, please contact the Public Advisor's Office at least five business days prior to the hearing date. Any changes to the dates, times and locations of the hearings will be posted to the CPUC's Daily Calendar.

What is SDG&E's application?

On July 3, 2019, SDG&E® filed Application No. A.19-07-006 with the CPUC requesting authority to establish an EV high power (EV-HP) rate. The proposed EV-HP rate design is intended to simplify the rate structure for DC Fast Charging and Medium Duty/Heavy Duty Electric Vehicles and create an electric fueling option that is competitive with fossil fuels.

How does the rest of this process work?

At the Evidentiary Hearing, the assigned Administrative Law Judge (Judge) will receive testimony from SDG&E, consumer advocacy groups, and other parties to this proceeding. The hearing is open to the public but only those who are parties to the proceeding may present evidence, testimony, or be subject to cross-examination. The hearing, and documents submitted during the hearing, will become part of the formal record that the Judge will rely upon in writing a proposed decision to present to the Commissioners for their consideration.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision, which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Public Advocates Office (Cal Advocates) has reviewed this application. Cal Advocates is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent

with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals. Cal Advocates has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
