The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will hold Evidentiary Hearings at the time and place noted above to review San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E<sup>®</sup>) request to extend and modify its Power Your Drive (PYD) Pilot, an electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructure program designed to allow SDG&E to install EV charging at multi-unit dwellings and workplaces. SDG&E is requesting a revenue requirement of \$125.6 million over the years 2021-2084 to deploy this program.

At these Evidentiary Hearings, SDG&E, consumer advocacy groups, and other parties to this proceeding testify before a CPUC Administrative Law Judge (Judge) regarding SDG&E's request. The public can attend and listen to the hearings but are not allowed to testify.

**Please note:** Due to the Governor's directive and CPUC's ongoing efforts to protect customers and community members during COVID-19, the CPUC may determine that there will be no inperson physical location for the Evidentiary Hearings and may instead hold the hearings through other means such as via internet or via phone participation. # What is SDG&E's application?

On October 28, 2019, SDG&E filed its PYD Extension Application (Application) with the CPUC, seeking approval to increase certain electric rates for its customers. This Application proposes to collect \$125.6 million of revenue over the years 2021-2084 to deploy approximately 2,000 Level 2 EV charging ports over two years, with associated electrical infrastructure. SDG&E also requests to make changes to the program design approved in the PYD Pilot.

### How does the rest of this process work?

This application has been assigned to a Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt SDG&E's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding are currently reviewing SDG&E's application, including the Public Advocates Office, which is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
