How can I participate?

San Gabriel Valley Water Company (SGVWC) and the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) would like to hear from you. You are invited to participate in a Public Forum, also called a Public Participation Hearing (PPH), about SGVWC's Application 25-01-001.

These Public Forums are part of a formal proceeding that will be documented and placed into the formal record so the CPUC can make a decision about SGVWC's request. You can make comments and raise concerns to the CPUC Administrative Law Judge overseeing this application

You can also provide written public comments at any time during the proceeding at apps.cpuc.ca.gov/c/A2501001.

Why am I receiving this notice?

On January 2, 2025, SGVWC filed a General Rate Case (GRC) Application 25-01-001 with the CPUC. The application requests rate increases in SGVWC's Los Angeles County and Fontana Water Company divisions covering the fiscal years (July – June) 2026-2027, 2027-2028, and 2028-2029. If the CPUC approves this application, SGVWC will recover forecasted costs in rates over a three-year period beginning July 1, 2026. This will increase your bill.

Why is SGVWC requesting this rate increase?

The CPUC requires SGVWC to file a GRC application every three years. The purpose of this GRC is for SGVWC to recover its anticipated costs from July 2026 through June 2029. SGVWC projects that it will need to increase rates during this period as a result of the need to replace and upgrade aging

infrastructure and to recover increases in employee labor, benefits, and other expenses as a result of wage inflation and rising operating costs.

How could this affect my water bill?

If SGVWC's rate request is approved by the CPUC, the average residential customer in the Fontana Water Company division with a 5/8-inch meter using 12 Ccf (1 Ccf = 748 gallons) per month would see an increase of \$10.77 or 13.5%, from \$79.73 to \$90.50 in July 2026. In July 2027, the average residential customer in the Fontana Water Company division would see a monthly bill increase of \$3.46 or 3.8%, from \$90.50 to \$93.96. In July 2028, the average residential customer in the Fontana Water Company division would see a monthly bill increase of \$3.51 or 3.7%, from \$93.96 to \$97.47.

For qualifying residential customers enrolled in SGVWC's low-income customer rate assistance program, known as CAP, the average customer with a 5/8-inch meter using 12 Ccf per month would see an increase of \$8.76 or 13.4%, from \$65.39 to \$74.15 in July 2026. In July 2027, the average customer would see a monthly bill increase of \$3.46 or 4.7%, from \$74.15 to \$77.61. In July 2028, the average customer would see a monthly bill increase of \$3.52 or 4.5%, from \$77.61 to \$81.13.

Customers can reduce or even eliminate the impact of these increases by conserving water.

How does the rest of this process work?

This application has been assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt SGVWC's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding may review SGVWC's application, including the Public Advocates Office, which is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
