RE: PacifiCorp (U 901-E) Annual Report on the Mobile Home Park Utility Upgrade Program

In accordance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and Decision (D.) 20-04-004, Ordering Paragraph 10, PacifiCorp submits its annual report on the program to convert master-metered mobile home parks (MHP) to direct utility service.

Xaa-wan'-k'wvt Village & Resort, reached out to PacifiCorp in 2023, to express interest in the California Mobile Home Park Conversion Program (CA MHP Conversion Program). PacifiCorp determined that the property qualifies for the conversion program. As of the end of 2023, the conversion project status is active. The Company received a Letter of Intent from the CPUC for this customer, and the Company received the CA MHP Conversion Program Application for this project on November 29, 2023. The Company is waiting for a quote from the contractor hired by the MHP Owner before moving forward with this project.

The lead time for transformers needed for this project is 8 to 18 months due to supply chain delays. The Company expects to finish this project by end of 2024 depending on the order date and delivery of the transformers, but this project may not be completed until 2025 depending on delays.

Because the rate impact of this cost is minimal (less than a fraction of a percent), the Company did not calculate the rate impact of the employee time spent on this project in 2023. Time spent on this project was 20.5 hours.
