

San Gabriel Valley Water Company (San Gabriel) General Rate Case – D.20-08-006 Los Angeles Division

What Does D.20-08-006 Authorize for San Gabriel?

Increases in Operating Costs in the Following Areas Required Increases in Utility Revenue to be Recovered in Rates:

Infrastructure Investments

- Main Replacement
- Reservoir Construction & Maintenance
- Plant Improvement
- Water Treatment Facilities

Operation Expense Increases

- Payroll
 - Four new positions added
- Materials & Supplies
- Purchased Power

Cost Increases Required the Following Increase in Utility Revenue for the Period 2018-2020:

- 2020/2021: \$0.8 million (1.0%) above authorized 2019-2020 revenues
- 2021/2022*: \$5.8 million (7.5%) above proposed 2020-2021 revenues
- 2022/2023*: \$2.7 million (3.2%) above proposed 2021-2022 revenues

LA Division's 2020-2021 Revenue to be Recovered in Rates: \$77,518,083

Recovery and Refund of Balancing and Memorandum Accounts

- 12-month surcharge of \$0.1410 per ccf for recovery of six balancing accounts¹
- One-time surcredit based on meter size for refund of six memorandum accounts:²

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What Are the Residential Bill Impacts Based on Adopted Revenue Increases?

Bill Impacts

Excluding city tax, surcharges and refunds, an average residential customer with a 5/8-inch meter using 12 ccf (1 ccf = 748 gallons) would see a monthly decrease in each bill from 63.70 in 2019/2020 to 62.04 in 2020/2021. The same bill is estimated to be 67.33 in 2021/2022 and 69.78 in 2022/2023, resulting in an overall 9.5% rate increase over 3 years.
