Safety Issues – Clearances







- MHPs/MHCs have allowed additions to be built directly under existing service lines.
- Service lines may not be up to State or County code for clearance from or over buildings and structures.

Safety Issues – Meter Bases

- Meter bases may not be up to code.
- Improper meter base heights could be safety hazard to public or workers.
- Access issues would create safety concerns for utility personnel or EMS responders needing to perform an emergency disconnection.







Safety Issue – Service Line and Poles







- Open wire services in poor repair or improper sag.
- The condition and integrity of the poles to be transferred must be verified.

Requirements for Taking Ownership

- Property owners must initiate the transfer of ownership request.
- All facilities need to meet both current code and Pacific Power's service requirements.
- Easements and rights-of-way acceptable to Pacific Power must be provided for all transferred facilities.
- Service for short term occupancy (e.g. camptrailers, RVs, etc.) must be configured separately and are not acceptable to Pacific Power for individual metering.
