Energy Division has been authorized by D.17-10-017 to facilitate a workshop within 60 days of the Utilities' filing of their proposed approach to "determining the bill credit to end cost recovery of a Competing Provider's customers no longer eligible to participate in the similar demand response program...." [OP 3, D.17-10-017]. The purpose of this workshop is to gain feedback and develop consensus and/or alternatives on said proposal.

Background: On January 30, 2018, SDG&E, SCE, and PG&E (the Utilities) filed their bill credit proposal. Parties served informal comments on the Utilities' proposed approach by March 1, 2018. Within 30 days of this workshop, the Utilities are to file a Tier 3 Advice Letter (AL) with (1) a consensus approach or (2) one approach and other alternatives.
