Lack of Safety Hazards Notification Documentation

GO 95, Rule 18-B, Notification of Safety Hazards, states:

If a company, while performing inspections of its facilities, discovers a safety hazard(s) on or near a communications facility or electric facility involving another company, the inspecting company shall notify the other company and/or facility owner of such safety hazard(s) no later than 10 business days after the discovery. To the extent the inspecting company cannot determine the facility owner/operator, it shall contact the pole owner(s), who shall be responsible for promptly notifying the company owning/operating the facility with the safety hazard(s), normally not to exceed five business days after being notified of the safety hazard. The notification shall be documented and such documentation must be preserved by all parties for at least ten years.

MID does not document outgoing third-party safety hazard notifications. This practice does not meet the GO 95's safety hazard notification requirement.

The following GO 95 and GO 128 violations discovered by ESRB engineers during the field audit, were not documented and/or addressed by MID during its last detailed inspection as required by General Order 165:

Missing High Voltage Sign

GO 95, Rule 51.6-A, High Voltage Marking, states in part:

Poles which support line conductors of more than 750 volts shall be marked with high voltage signs. This marking shall consist of a single sign showing the words "HIGH VOLTAGE", or pair of signs showing the words "HIGH" and "VOLTAGE", not more than six (6) inches in height with letters not less than 3 inches in height. Such signs shall be of weather and corrosion—resisting material, solid or with letters cut out therefrom and clearly legible.

The High Voltage sign on the pole was missing.

Missing Guy Marker

A substantial marker of suitable material, including but not limited to metal or plastic, not less than 8 feet in length, shall be securely attached to all anchor guys. Where more than one guy is attached to an anchor rod, only the outermost guy is required to have a marker.

The guy guard on the anchor guy was missing.

Foreign Attachment

GO 95, Rule 34, Foreign Attachments, states in part:

Nothing in these rules shall be construed as permitting the unauthorized attachment, to supply, street light or communication poles or structures, of antennas, signs, posters, banners, decorations, wires, lighting fixtures, guys, ropes and any other such equipment foreign to the purposes of overhead electric line construction.

A third party sign was attached to the pole.

Fallen Guy Wire

GO 95, Rule 56.2, Overhead Guys, Anchor Guys and Span Wires Use, states in part:

Guys shall be attached to structures, as nearly as practicable, at the center of load. They shall be maintained taut and of such strength as to meet the safety factors of Rule 44.

A guy wire was unattached from the pole and lying on the ground.

Padmount Transformer Not Bolted Down

GO 128, Rule 34.3-A, Self-contained Surface-mounted Equipment, states:

The equipment case or enclosure shall be secured in place and be of sufficient strength to resist entrance or damage to the equipment by unauthorized persons.

The padmount transformer was not bolted down.
