Executive Summary

On September 5, 2020, Southern California Edison (SCE) remotely activated¹ an Incident Management Team (IMT) to manage a weather event where forecasted high temperatures, high winds, and low relative humidity levels were anticipated to potentially require the use of SCE's Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) protocol; which could impact as many as 122,000 customers. Customers within Kern, Ventura, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Orange, and Riverside Counties were in scope with a period of concern from September 8th to September 9th.

Ultimately, at 2:38 AM on September 8th, SCE pro-actively de-energized 252 customers in Los Angeles, and Ventura Counties due to actual weather conditions. Power was restored to all customers on September 9th by 3:26 PM, except for 20 customers within Los Angeles County that were impacted by the Bobcat fire. Power to these customers was restored on September 12th at 08:10 AM.

This report is submitted to demonstrate SCE's compliance with the directives of Resolution ESRB-8 and the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) Order to Institute Rulemaking (OIR) Phase 1 (D. 19-05-042) and Phase 2 (D.20-05-051) requirements associated with PSPS events. Specifically, this report explains SCE's decision to call, sustain, and curtail a de-energization event as required and provides an event summary and responses to post-event reporting questions as required by the Commission.

SCE appreciates that PSPS de-energizations pose significant challenges and hardships for its customers and the Public Safety Partners that provide vital services to our communities. SCE's decision to activate its PSPS protocol is based on careful consideration of multiple factors including forecasted weather conditions, impacts to Public Safety Partners and the communities we serve. The advance notifications of a potential PSPS event are intended to serve as an alert to our Public Safety Partners and customers of the potential need to de-energize to protect public safety from the risk of a wildfire. As such, a notification of a potential de-energization is not a guarantee that an actual de-energization will take place. Rather, it is a warning that a de-energization event could take place so that customers and Public Safety Partners have the information they need to be prepared and respond to the events as they develop. SCE also provides notices of an imminent de-energization when the decision to de-energize the system has become necessary. Because SCE takes seriously its responsibilities to its customers, and Public Safety Partners and understands the impacts of de-energization events, SCE only resorts to PSPS de-energization when SCE believes that there are no other reasonable alternatives to mitigate identified risks to public safety.

SCE remains committed to continuously improving its processes and welcomes input from its customers, Public Safety Partners, community representatives, and local governments on ways we can work together to enhance the existing processes, improve communication and coordination amongst impacted entities, and minimize the impact of PSPS events on all stakeholders.

SCE took the following actions to manage its response during the PSPS event:

- 1. Activated a Dedicated PSPS IMT to coordinate response operations associated with the potential use of PSPS to maintain public safety. The IMT was activated and operated remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Reached out to the Geographical Coordination Center (GACC) to sync on their expectation for fire potential over the course of the PSPS event.
- 3. Notified Public Safety Partners, critical infrastructure providers, the CPUC, the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE), the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), and affected SCE customers. Additionally, SCE Notified Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) such as Independent Living Centers (ILCs), the American Red Cross, 2-1-1, and Fire Safety Councils.
- 4. Initiated operating restrictions on impacted circuits as applicable.
- 5. Performed field patrols of impacted circuits in preparation for the potential use of PSPS.
- 6. Opened Community Resource Centers (CRCs) or deployed Community Crew Vehicles (CCVs) to impacted communities.
- 7. Performed live field observations of monitored circuits as required during the period of concern to validate actual weather conditions and the need for the use of PSPS for deenergization.
- 8. Performed post patrols to verify no damage to de-energized circuits in support of restoration activities.

Event Summary September 4 to September 11, 2020²

On Friday, September 4, Weather services notified SCE's Business Resiliency Duty Manager (BRDM) of a weather system that was forecasted to bring excessive heat watches, fire weather threats, and red flag warnings for most of the SCE territory beginning September 8 and continuing through September 9. SCE contacted the Southern California Geographical Coordination Center (GACC) regarding the forecasted weather. SCE sent the CPUC an email on the evening of September 4 to communicate the intent to stand up a Public Safety Power Shut Off Incident Management Team (PSPS IMT) on September 5. Initially SCE identified 28 Distribution circuits and approximately 122,000 customers in scope for the potential PSPS event.

On the morning of Saturday, September 5, the SCE service territory continued to experience high temperatures. Daytime high temperatures up to 125 degrees were expected in portions of Orange, Kern, Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura, and Los Angeles Counties. SCE activated its dedicated PSPS IMT and held a State Executive call at 2 PM, and an OEM County Coordination call at 3 PM. At 3:54 PM, SCE followed up with an email to the CPUC to provide confirmation of the PSPS IMT activation along with the identified Counties in scope for a period of concern beginning September 8 through September 9. SCE sent 72-hour notifications to public safety partners at 8:20 PM and critical infrastructure customers at 8:48 PM.

On Sunday, September 6, weather forecasts included a strong ridge of high pressure remaining anchored overhead with offshore flow across the LA Basin. Triple digit temperatures were observed all the way to the coast in areas of the LA Basin. High temperatures were forecast to reach 105-110 degrees in metro LA, with upper 90s to around 100 degrees possible along the coast. High temperatures across the Inland Empire were forecast to range from 114-118. Some areas of the LA Basin were forecast to exceed all-time high temperature records on September 6. Red flag warnings were forecasted for Monday into Tuesday morning and a fire weather watch remained in effect after 11 AM Tuesday through Tuesday evening. Weather forecasts now led to 70 circuits and approximately 71,256 customers as potentially being in scope for de-energization on September 8 through September 9.

SCE remained in contact with the GACC regarding weather forecasts. SCE provided an event update to the CPUC at 12 PM. SCE held a State Executive call at 2 PM, and an OEM County Coordination call at 3 PM. SCE sent 48-hour notifications to customers, including critical infrastructure, and public safety partners at 12:29 PM and 1:13 PM.

On Monday, September 7, SCE service territory continued to experience high temperatures as forecasted on September 6. Excessive heat warnings, fire weather threats and red flag warnings were in effect for most of the SCE service territory through the evening on September 7. Daytime temperatures up to 120 degrees were expected in some areas. Weather forecasts now led to 77 circuits and approximately 74,369 customers as potentially being in scope for de-energization on September 8 through September 9.

SCE provided an event update to the CPUC at 8:30 PM. SCE held a State Executive call at 2 PM, and OEM County Coordination call at 3 PM. SCE sent 24-hour notifications to customers, including critical infrastructure, and public safety partners at 1:26 PM and 8:38 PM.

At approximately 5 PM, SCE added identified additional circuits in scope for the period of concern on September 8 through September 9 in the Lake Arrowhead area. Given this short timeframe for awareness of these circuits potentially being in scope for de-energization, SCE was not able to send 72 hour and 48-hour notifications to Public Safety Partners, local government and customers. Initial customer notifications for these circuits were sent at 8:38 PM (16 hours prior to the period of concern, which was September 8 at 12 PM to September 9 at 3 PM) to public safety partners, and local governments. Lake Arrowhead received initial notifications to customers, including critical infrastructure, and public safety partners at 8:38 PM (16 hours prior to the period of concern, which was September 8 at 12 PM to September 9 at 3 PM) 72/48 hour notifications were not sent because these circuits were not initially in scope.

On Tuesday, September 8, the temperatures were expected to begin dropping into the mid-80s and low 90s through the end of the week. There were ongoing wind advisories, high wind watches, fire weather threats and red flag warnings in effect for most of the SCE service territory through the evening of Wednesday September 9, with expected wind gusts of 20-55 mph expected in some areas. Weather forecasts now led to 44 circuits and approximately 54,369 customers potentially being in scope for de-energization on September 8 through September 9.

SCE provided an event update to the CPUC at 7:24 PM. SCE held a State Executive call at 2 PM, and an OEM County Coordination call at 3 PM. SCE sent 24-hour notifications to customers, including public safety partners, and critical infrastructure at 12:17 PM and 7:31 PM. A portion of a single circuit (Fingal) customers received imminent notification at 9:16PM.

On Wednesday, September 9, the Santa Ana winds were ongoing across the Southern California mountains, with peak gusts generally in the most exposed mountainous areas. Weather models indicated that Santa Ana winds would continue for the next few hours before decreasing significantly. The very dry air mass associated with the Santa Ana winds would overspread the valleys and coastal areas through the morning hours, bringing moderate fire danger to all Southern California areas on September 9. Fire threats were expected to lessen during night on September 9 and on September 10, though conditions would remain very warm and dry. Los Angeles and Ventura counties remained in scope. Customers including public safety partners, and critical infrastructure on 6 circuits where thresholds were forecasted to be met received imminent shut down notifications between 1:46 AM and 6:00 AM. On September 9 SCE de-energized 252 customers in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. The details of de-energization are set out in a table on page 6.

SCE provided an event update to the CPUC at 8 PM. SCE held a State Executive call at 2 PM, and OEM County Coordination call at 3 PM. All PSPS update notifications to government officials in Kern, Riverside, Los Angeles, Ventura, San Bernardino, and Orange Counties were completed as of 12 PM. SCE sent all-clear notifications to customers that were no longer in scope for the current PSPS event at 4:24 PM. One circuit remained de-energized (Redbox Circuit) due to its proximity to the Bobcat fire. SCE tried to contact four residential customers impacted by the Redbox circuit de-energization but contact with these customers was unsuccessful because the area was evacuated due to the Bobcat fire.

On Thursday September 10, SCE was unable to patrol or restore service to customers on the Redbox circuit because restrictions related to the Bobcat fire were in effect. SCE did not have the clearance to perform ground patrols or air patrol due to FAA restrictions. There were 20 customers impacted by the Redbox circuit de-energization. SCE made the decision to transfer restoration of the remaining Redbox circuit to the Incident Support Team (IST) managing the concurrent fire events and demobilize the PSPS IMT given no remaining circuits de-energized and no remaining circuits remained in scope. FAA restrictions were lifted on September 11, however due to lack of visibility from smoke, SCE was unable to perform aerial patrol of the circuit. SCE initiated patrols at 6:45 AM on September 12 and power was restored to the remaining 20 customers on September 12 at 08:10 AM.

The following responses address how SCE complied with all applicable PSPS regulatory requirements, including ESRB-8 and the Phase 1 (D. 19-05-042) and Phase 2 (D. 20-05-051) decisions, during this event.

1. The time, place and duration of the power shutoff event

This event started on Saturday, September 5th, and continued through Friday, September 11th, and impacted portions of Kern, Ventura, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Orange, and Riverside counties.

2. The local communities' representatives contacted prior to de-energization, the date on which they were contacted, and whether the areas affected by the de-energization are classified as Zone 1, Tier 2, or Tier 3 as per the definition in General Order 95, Rule 21.2³

3. If unable to provide customers with notice at least 2 hours prior to the de-energization event, provide an explanation in its report.

SCE provided all potentially affected customers with notice at least 2 hours prior to the deenergization event except for the 9 Sand Canyon customers as detailed in Attachment B-Customer and Critical Infrastructure Notifications.

4. Summarize the number and nature of complaints received as the result of the de-energization event and include claims that are filed due to de-energization.

As of the submission of this report, no formal complaints were submitted to the Commission or SCE Consumer Affairs and no claims have been submitted for this event. Any complaints/claims received after submission of this report will be added to subsequent reports, as they are received and processed.

Separate from this event, but included here, is a clarification to the 6.28.20 SCE PSPS Post Event Report. In its report submitted on August 18, 2020, SCE stated that we reached out to AT&T regarding a letter of concern sent to the CPUC on July 17, 2020. In fact, it was AT&T that initiated the conversation regarding the PSPS event on June 28^{th.} SCE discussed the event with AT&T on July 2nd and July 7th. Conversations between AT&T and SCE were also held on SCE September 14, 2020 to discuss the concerns in the letter sent to the CPUC.

³See Attachment A Public Safety Partner Notifications. SCE also contacted other County and State public safety and first responder agencies and local governments for areas that were not de-energized but were within the scope of concern.

5. The timeline for power restoration (re-energization), in addition to the steps taken to restore power as required in Resolution ESRB-8.

A PSPS event will last if dangerous fire weather conditions exist and there is a threat of a wildfire event. If circuits are shut off, those circuits and lines will be inspected to ensure there is no damage before power can be safely restored. Any visual inspection of the power lines must take place during daylight hours for safety and accuracy and operations may be limited during overnight hours.

With respect to the event at issue in this report, SCE performed post patrols for damage on the 6 circuits that were de-energized due to the PSPS event. Once the circuits were cleared, notification of re-energization was sent to customers, and the circuits were re-energized. 5 of the 6 circuits were re-energized within 24 hours from the time of de-energization. The remaining circuit was re-energized, as explained below, on 9/12. Specific details regarding the restoration timeline for this event can be found in the Event Summary above.

6. For any circuits that require more than 24 hours to restore, the utility shall explain why it was unable to restore each circuit within this timeframe in its post event report.

The Redbox circuit could not be re-energized within 24 hours because access was restricted due to the Bobcat fire impact area. There were 20 customers (4 residential) impacted by the deenergization of the Redbox circuit. This circuit was moved from the PSPS event over to the existing Incident Support Team (IST) managing fire operations for resolution. The Redbox circuit was re-energized on 9/12 after clearance was given from the Bobcat Fire Incident Management Team for the SCE Monrovia District to patrol the circuit by ground.

7. Identify the address of each community assistance location during the deenergization event, describe the location (in a building, a trailer, etc.), and describe the assistance available at each location, and give the days and hours that it was open.

Each of the CRC/CCV locations were equipped with ice vouchers or ice, water, customer resiliency kit (containing PSPS program information, mask, gloves, hand sanitizer, solar power battery charger or an LED light with built-in battery.)

8. Any wind-related damage(s) to SCE's overhead equipment in the areas where power is shutoff.

No wind-related damage was found on SCE's overhead equipment during post patrol in the areas where circuits were de-energized.

⁴ CRC/CCV operation coincided with the period of concern in each area, which resulted in actual hours of operation that are different from the CRC/CCV available hours.

9. All factors considered by SCE in its decision to shut off power, including wind speed, temperature, humidity, and vegetation moisture in the vicinity of the de-energized circuits

SCE's decision to shut off power is dynamic and made by considering such factors as:

- National Weather Service-issued watches and warnings for high fire risk areas in our territory.
- Ongoing assessments from our in-house meteorologists using high-resolution weather models, data from SCE weather stations and publicly available weather stations.
- The SCE Fire Potential Index (FPI), a tool that utilizes weather data, fuel conditions, and vegetation moisture content to rate the daily fire potential across our region.
 - Low 11.99
 - Elevated 12-14.99
 - Extreme 15 and above
- Wind speeds, particularly when they exceed or are expected to exceed National Weather Service Wind Advisory levels (defined as 31 mph sustained wind speed and 46 mph gust wind speed) or exceed the top 1% of historical wind speeds in the area. Wind speeds are particularly important when we consider them in combination with other local conditions, such as dry vegetation, that could present a true hazard for the community. Wind speed thresholds may also be adjusted based on other factors or circuit design.
- Specific concerns received from state and local fire authorities, emergency management personnel and/or law enforcement regarding public safety issues.
- The expected impact of turning off power to essential services such as public safety agencies, water pumps and/or traffic controls.
- Other operational considerations, such as the state of the potentially impacted circuits, flying debris and/or downed wires.
- Deployment of on-the-ground observers in high fire risk areas to monitor live conditions in real time.

Prior to de-energization of the 6 circuits, SCE considered the following factors listed in the table below to inform de-energization decisions:

10. Evaluation of alternatives to de-energization that were considered, and mitigation measures used to decrease the risk of utility-caused wildfire in the de-energized area and an explanation of how the utility determined that the benefit of de-energization outweighed the potential public safety risks:

Prior to de-energizing the 6 circuits, SCE implemented operational procedures to minimize or eliminate the potential for a spark to occur. Specifically, SCE implemented fast curve settings protective relays, which are designed to limit the fault energy and more quickly de-energize the line should a fault occur. SCE also implemented operating restrictions and blocked reclosers on these circuits so that if the circuit did relay, it could not automatically reclose. Implementation of these settings also require SCE to patrol the line and remove any potential safety hazards found before re-energizing even though the circuit was not pro-actively de-energized.

SCE used sectionalizing through RAR devices or switches on all circuits de-energized to isolate and de-energize the portions of circuits most impacted. This decision was made to help mitigate PSPS impacts on our stakeholders by minimizing the scope of PSPS as much as safely possible. While avoiding de-energization entirely was not possible, SCE has taken steps to reduce the impacts of the event on the community and considered the impacts of the de-energization on its stakeholders within the context of the risk posed by the prevailing weather conditions and the public safety risk of catastrophic fire ignition.

11. A copy of all notifications, the timing of notifications, the methods of notifications and who made the notifications (the utility or local public safety partners).

A copy of all notifications and the timing of notifications can be found in Attachment A - Public Safety Partner Notifications, Attachment B - Critical Infrastructure and Customer Notifications and Attachment C - PSPS Activation Customer Notification Messaging.

All PSPS event notifications to key stakeholders, including Public Safety Partners and customers, are delivered via voice, email, and TTY (telecommunication device for the hearing impaired) formats as per the preference of the recipient. Notifications are offered in multiple languages. All notifications were made by SCE.

12. Number of affected customers broken down by all classifications including residential, medical baseline, commercial/industrial, etc.

A detailed description of the number of affected customers broken down by all classifications including residential, medical baseline, commercial/industrial, etc. is provided in Attachment B-Customer and Critical Infrastructure Notifications.

13. An explanation of the circumstances that resulted in failure to communicate a potential pro-active de-energization event, if any.

When possible, SCE strives to provide priority notification to Public Safety Partners (including CalOES, the CPUC, and county emergency management officials) three days ahead of the initial forecasted the period of concern. Weather forecasts developed in this event that prevented SCE from providing sufficient advance notice of potential de-energization to nine customers on the Sand Canyon Circuit. The Sand Canyon circuit was not originally forecasted to exceed its PSPS threshold and therefore was not in scope for de-energization. However, weather stations indicated conditions exceeding PSPS criteria for both fuel and wind speeds during the PSPS event. This required immediate actions to be taken as determined by the Incident Commander resulting in only imminent notifications being able to be executed as detailed in the tables on page 7 and 11 of this report.

14. Each electric investor-owned utility shall enumerate and explain the cause of any false communications in its post event reports by citing the sources of changing data.

SCE notes that its PSPS notices before potential de-energization only provide a warning to customers of a possible de-energization event. SCE notices are designed to give customers notice that a de-energization could take place and a time frame within which the event is most likely to occur so that customers can act and prepare. Given the unpredictability of weather on the ground, however, SCE's advance notices do not affirmatively confirm that a circuit will be deenergized. In fact, for clarity, SCE does not provide any affirmative notifications until an actual deenergization has taken place.

SCE believes that its notices are correct and factual. However, except with respect to the 252 customers that were de-energized, the rest of the customers who received notice of a possible de-energization were not in fact taken off-line. SCE believes that the definition of false positive is subject to interpretation about which notifications should be included. In effort to assure transparency and full compliance, SCE will at this time treat all pre-event notices here as potential "false positives" within the meaning of the PSPS guidance. However, SCE ultimately believes that such designation is only appropriate for notices of imminent de-energization or re-energization (1-4 hours) that did not take place. SCE would appreciate any additional Commission clarification or guidance on this issue to assure it is fully compliant.

SCE notes that "false positives" typically refer to decisions made, or actions taken based on erroneous information. Differences between notifications and actual de-energizations, however, do not stem from incorrect data, but rather from actual ground conditions varying from forecast conditions and the SCE desire to provide customers with warning of a potential event so that they can take precautionary measures. This variance is inherent and unavoidable because of the constantly changing nature of emergent weather. SCE hopes that the Commission will take this into consideration when clarifying the definition of false positives/negatives going forward.

15. A description and evaluation of engagement with local and state public safety partners in providing advanced education and outreach during the de-energization event.

Advanced education and outreach of this Public Safety Power Shutoff event was communicated to all impacted county emergency management officials, CalOES, and the Commission before any forecasted weather was scheduled to impact the SCE service territory. Regular updates were provided throughout the event using the CalOES PSPS Notification Form, daily situational awareness and coordination calls and individual contact with Public Safety Partners in the affected counties.

16. For those customers where positive or affirmative notification was attempted, an accounting of the customers (which tariff and/or access and functional needs population designation), the number of notification attempts made, the timing of attempts, who made the notification attempt (utility or public safety partner) and the number of customers for whom positive notification was achieved.

SCE only tracks critical care customers for positive or affirmative receipt of notification attempts. Notifications are made daily as these customers remain on potentially impacted circuits. There were 45 critical care customers requiring secondary verification during this PSPS event and SCE made positive contact with all of them.

17. A description of how sectionalizing, i.e., separating loads within a circuit, was considered and implemented and the extent to which it impacted the size and scope of the de-energization event.

There were approximately 1,817 total customers in scope for actual de-energization during the period of concern for this event. SCE reduced the number of customers impacted by de-energization to 252 customers using switching playbooks that identified sectionalizing devices to limit the scope of the event. SCE used an RAR device to separate and isolate the de-energization area, limiting the de-energization impacts. During the process of sectionalizing, 1,564 customers temporarily lost power (approx. 5-11 min) but SCE is not including this count of de-energized customers due to the fact that this was a technical extremely short loss of power related to switching operations and the customers at issue were not actually impacted by the PSPS events.

18. An explanation of how the utility determined that the benefit of deenergization outweighed potential public safety risks.

In considering the impacts of potential de-energization, SCE consults daily with County Emergency Management Officials to identify potential public safety concerns. In connection with this event, SCE did not receive any requests to forego de-energization through any of these daily calls. SCE took measures to reduce de-energization to only 252 customers out of the nearly 1,817 customers that were potentially in scope for the event by de-energizing only the portions of the circuits where fire weather conditions were present and by leveraging sectionalizing devices to isolate only the customers in the areas of highest risk. While avoiding de-energization entirely was not possible, SCE took steps to isolate the de-energization area through sectionalizing in consideration of the impacts of the event within the context of the risk posed by the prevailing weather conditions; as well as the risk of catastrophic fire without de-energization.

19. Lessons learned from the de-energization events.

This PSPS event occurred simultaneously with an extreme heat event that had the potential for rotating outages. There were also several fires burning throughout the SCE service territory with fire-related power loss caused by fires taking lines out of service. Each of these separate events impacted the same portions of the SCE service territory, posing the potential for overlapping impacts. Therefore, SCE found it necessary during daily coordination calls with impacted counties to provide ongoing comprehensive situational awareness to the impacted jurisdictions on the potential and types of outages that may occur. SCE was also able to quickly assure that customers, impacted by multiple ongoing events, were not subject to multiple outages by removing customers in HFRAs from the rotating outage load blocks for load shedding.

20. Any recommended updates to the guidelines adopted in Resolution ESRB-8 and this decision.

SCE would appreciate clarification related to false negative and false positive communications presented in D.20-05-051. SCE notes that "false positives or negatives" typically refer to decisions made, or actions taken based on erroneous information. Differences between notifications and actual de-energizations, however, do not stem from incorrect data, but rather from actual ground conditions varying from forecast conditions, as is the case with every weather forecast. This variance is inherent because of the constantly changing nature of emergent weather.

SCE also believes that the relevant timeframe for assessing the numbers of customers who received notification but did not get de-energized/re-energized or who were de-energized without notification should be limited to imminent notification made within 1-4 hours of a deenergization event or actual de-energization without notice. Weather conditions during PSPS events are dynamic and can change very quickly, and 1, 2, or 3-day advance notifications inherently has significant variability built in.

It is not clear if any and all notifications of potential PSPS would be considered to be a false positive, or if this would be limited to instances when a customer receives notification that PSPS is imminent but is not actually de-energized. The same clarification would be appreciated on false negative communications i.e. de-energizations without 1-4-hour notice. SCE recommends that only (1) imminent de-energization notices (1-4 hours) when de-energization does not take place; (2) imminent re-energization notices when no re-energization took place within the period of time indicated in the notice; or (3) de-energization without any notice be considered in the context of reporting false positive and false negative notifications.

SCE hopes that the Commission will take this into consideration when clarifying the definition of false positives and negatives going forward.
