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Executive Summary

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) submits this annual report on the California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) 2024 program activities to the Legislature, pursuant to California Public Utilities (Pub. Util.) Code section 914.7.

Since 2008, the CASF has helped close the Digital Divide in California by providing subsidies to build and expand broadband facilities to unserved areas of the state. The program has funded fiber- optic, fixed wireless, hybrid fiber-coaxial, and copper facility-based projects to bring broadband access to communities across the state and make progress towards the CASF Broadband Infrastructure Grant Account (Infrastructure Account) goal of providing broadband access to no less than 98 percent of households in each consortium region by 2032.¹

The CASF program is composed of six sub-accounts: (1) Infrastructure Account, (2) Broadband Adoption Account, (3) Broadband Public Housing Account, (4) Rural and Urban Regional Broadband Consortia Grant Account, (5) Line Extension Program, and (6) Tribal Technical Assistance Program. This report presents financial and programmatic highlights, including revenues, expenditures, approved projects, plans for 2025 and expected benefits. It also provides updates on unserved/served areas and broadband adoption in the state. In 2024, the CPUC approved:

- five Infrastructure Account grants in the amount of \$46,624,124 to provide broadband access to 3,122 unserved households;
- seven Tribal Technical Assistance grants to six Tribes, including three Tribes new to the program, totaling \$1,471,900 for feasibility studies, market studies, and business plans;
- 97 Broadband Adoption grants totaling \$11.01 million, which will provide digital literacy training to 20,717 residents and broadband access to 22,731 participants; and
- 45 Broadband Public Housing grants totaling \$3.40 million to provide free broadband service to 3,830 households.

In 2020, the CPUC opened Rulemaking (R.) 20-08-021 to implement programmatic modifications, adopt rules to amplify broadband infrastructure deployment, and leverage funding sources to meet program goals. Since then, multiple decisions have been adopted, enabling the expansion of eligibility criteria and the modification and clarification of requirements and guidelines across the six CASF programs.²

On March 7, 2024, the CPUC issued Decision (D.) 24-03-041 modifying the CASF Broadband Public Housing Account rules and guidelines expanding eligibility for non-publicly supported housing developments and for project costs. As part of that same decision, the CPUC also modified the Tribal Technical Assistance (TTA) program to align with the CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistance (LATA) program³ rules and guidelines.

Projects Awarded in 2024

Table 1 below details the CASF total projects and awards in 2024 and since program inception in 2008. The CASF expenditure data, including project payments and administrative expenses, are provided in Table 4.

CASF Program Goal and Broadband Deployment Progress

The statutory goal of the CASF Infrastructure Account is to provide broadband access to no less than 98 percent of households in each consortia region by December 31, 2032. California has 15 consortia regions made up of various counties in the state. See Map 1 for the locations of the consortia regions. Data for fixed broadband availability (includes wireline and fixed wireless service) as of December 31, 2023, reveal the following:

- Infrastructure Account Goal: Statewide, 97.49 percent of households are served by at least 25 megabits per second (Mbps) downstream and 3 Mbps upstream fixed consumer broadband. See Attachment A for the percentage of households served in each consortium.
- **Broadband Adoption at 25 Mbps/3 Mbps:** Approximately 69.34 percent of California households subscribe to broadband speeds at or above 25/3 Mbps.

CASF Team Key Accomplishments in 2024

Broadband Infrastructure Grant Account:

- Awarded 5 projects for \$46,624,124 to connect 3,122 unserved households in the counties of Fresno, Los Angeles, Monterey, Orange, Riverside, San Benito, San Diego, San Mateo, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, and Santa Cruz.
- Final payment reimbursements for eight completed projects totaling \$9,945,262, serving 719 households across Plumas, Del Norte, Ventura, Nevada, Kern, Lassen and Sierra counties.

Line Extension Program:

- Made final payment reimbursement for \$2,575 in March 2024 on the Grass Valley Project (completed in June 2023) connecting one previously unserved location.
- 60% project completion progress for the South Valley Internet Southside Road Project connecting 179 homes.
- Developed a staff proposal to update the Line Extension Program. There is continued development of Line Extension Program rules and guidelines.

Broadband Adoption Account:

- Awarded grants to 97 projects totaling \$11,006,616 across 31 entities in 33 counties statewide, serving 43,448 participants.
- Completion of 21 Digital Literacy Broadband Adoption Account projects bringing digital literacy training to 5,048 participants.

Broadband Consortia Account:

- CPUC continued to fund 15 active Consortia.
- Developed a staff proposal to update the Consortia Account. There is continued development of Broadband Consortia Account rules and guidelines.

Broadband Public Housing Account:

- Awarded grants to 45 projects for 12 applicants in thirteen counties serving 3,830 units, totaling \$3,433,236.
- 21 Public Housing Account funded projects were completed in 2024; 20 infrastructure projects which wired up 869 residential units, and one adoption project provided digital literacy training to 129 residents.

• Established eligibility of "other housing developments and mobile home parks with low-income residents," verification of eligibility, and protections of tenants of non-publicly supported housing developments in D 24-03-041.

Tribal Technical Assistance:

- On March 7, 2024, the CPUC issued D. 24-03-041 modifying the TTA program by expanding the list of eligible activities and allowable work products, increasing the total grant amount to \$250,000 per Tribe per FY, and requiring any technical assistance for a broadband infrastructure project must reliably meet or exceed speeds of 25/3 Mbps.
- Awarded seven grants to six Tribes, including three Tribes new to the program, totaling \$1,471,900 for feasibility studies, market studies, and business plans.

Broadband Mapping:

• Understanding the level of broadband availability across California is critical to focus investment to communities that lack essential broadband service. The Broadband Mapping team issued the Annual Broadband Data Request to collect broadband data as of December 31, 2023 that includes broadband deployment and subscription data at the location level from 130 Internet Service Providers (ISPs). Furthermore, the CPUC maintains and updates a statewide, publicly accessible, and interactive map showing the accessibility of broadband service in California. The CPUC California Interactive Broadband Map is available at https://www.broadbandmap.ca.gov/.

Introduction

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) manages the California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) Program. The goal of the CASF program is to encourage the deployment of high-quality advanced communications services to all Californians, which will promote economic growth, job creation, and the substantial social benefits of advanced information and communications technologies. CASF consists of the following active accounts and programs:

- The Broadband Infrastructure Grant Account (Infrastructure Account) provides grants to deploy broadband to unserved households.
- The Line Extension Program (LEP) provides grants to individual low-income households or property
 owners to offset the costs of connecting to an existing or proposed facility-based broadband provider.
- The Tribal Technical Assistance (TTA) provides grants to Tribes to develop work products such as market studies, feasibility studies and business plans to pursue improved communications infrastructure.
- The Rural and Urban Regional Broadband Consortia Account (Consortia Account) provides grants to regional consortia to facilitate the deployment of broadband infrastructure by assisting CASF infrastructure grant applicants in the project development or grant application process or assisting broadband deployment projects related to programs created under Senate Bill (SB) 156 and Assembly Bill (AB) 164.
- The Broadband Adoption Account (Adoption Account) provides grants to increase publicly available or after-school broadband access and digital inclusion, such as digital literacy training programs.
- The Broadband Public Housing Account (Public Housing Account) provides broadband connectivity
 grants to low-income communities which includes, but is not limited to, publicly supported housing
 developments, farmworker housing, and other housing developments or mobile home parks with lowincome residents, as determined by the CPUC.

Legislation in 2024 Modifying the CASF

In March 2024, the Commission modified the Public Housing Account rules and guidelines to expand eligibility for non-publicly supported housing developments. The modifications also increased project cost caps, costs allowed, and the broadband speed threshold that customers should receive. For infrastructure projects, the threshold was increased to 25/3 Mbps. For internet extension projects, the threshold was increased to 100/20 Mbps.

During that same time period, the Commission modified the Tribal Technical Assistance program to align with the Local Agency Technical Assistance program rules and guidelines, increasing technical assistance grants of up to \$250,000 (from \$150,000) per year per tribe and expanding eligible program activities. Projects funded after March 2024 are subject to the rules and guidelines adopted in D.24-03-041.

Plans for 2025

- The CPUC will set forth funding allocations for FY 2024-25 for the CASF accounts.
- The CPUC will conduct a CASF workshop in April 2025 to consult with regional consortia, stakeholders, local governments, the federal government, Tribal governments, existing facility-based broadband providers, and consumers regarding unserved areas of the state and cost-effective strategies for expanding access to broadband.
- For the Line Extension Program, the CPUC is working to make changes to the program rules and guidelines previously set in D.19-04-022. Staff will continue to administer the \$1,770,748 grant to construct the South Valley Road Project.
- For the Public Housing Account, the CPUC will implement the expansion of program eligibility and verification requirements for housing developments including Tribal Housing, and mobile home parks with low-income residents.⁹
- The Adoption Account will look to modify application requirements and guidelines through CASF Rulemaking 20-08-021. The Adoption Account and Public Housing Account application window opened on January 1, 2025, and a second will open on July 1, 2025.
- For the Consortia Account, 15 Consortia regions across the state will facilitate the deployment of broadband services across their respective regions by assisting CASF infrastructure grant applicants in the project development or grant application process. Consortia will also assist in the development of broadband deployment projects related to programs created under SB 156 and AB 164. The Consortia Account is working to make programmatic changes to application requirements and guidelines through R.20-08-021.
- Tribal Technical Assistance will continue to accept applications quarterly until funds are exhausted and expand outreach efforts to increase awareness and seek ideas for other uses for these funds.

Overview and Financial Information

This section provides an overview of the CASF program financial information including revenues, amount of funds expended, and fund balance from the inception of the program in 2008 through FY 2023-24 (i.e. July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024). This section also provides information about the areas in California that remain unserved and information on broadband adoption levels, as required by Pub. Util. Code section 914.7 subsections (a) and (g).

On June 8, 2023, the Commission approved Resolution T-17782 establishing the CASF FY 2023-24 program budget and budget allocations for the six CASF sub-accounts. Table 2 below presents the allocated account budgets and the total amount awarded by Commission approved resolutions or CD issued ministerial award letters in FY 2023-24.

Financial Information

The CPUC records and tracks CASF financial activities in the Financial Information System for California (FI\$Cal), which is an information technology system for accounting, budget, and cash management for all state agencies. Financial information presented in tables below is based on data maintained in FI\$Cal compiled in accordance with the applicable laws, regulations, policies, procedures, and instructions.

CASF Revenues

CASF collected \$106.78 million in FY 2023-24 and has an accumulated total revenue of \$729.37 million since the inception of the program as presented in Table 3.

CASF Funds Expended

CASF expended \$44.65 million in FY 2023-24 and an accumulated total expenditure of \$318.25 million since the inception of the program, as presented in Table 4.¹² CASF expenditures are grouped into three major categories:

- Local Assistance includes funds distributed to grantees for awarded grants;
- State Operations at the CPUC include operating expenses of the CPUC for the administration of the CASF program, such as staff salaries and benefits, travel, training, consultant services, and administrative overhead costs, etc.; and
- State Operations of Other State Departments include pro-rated statewide general administrative expenses, supplemental pension payments, and other expenses.

CASF Fund Balance as of June 30, 2024

As of June 30, 2024, CASF retained an ending fund balance of \$441.03 million and a net fund balance of \$288.66 million after outstanding encumbrances as presented in Table 5.

Projected Surcharge Amount to be Collected

On October 10, 2022, the CPUC adopted D.22-10-021 transitioning the Public Purpose Programs (PPPs) ¹³ surcharge mechanism to a flat rate for each active access line that telephone corporations service in California. D.22-10-021 also approved an interim surcharge rate of \$1.11 to take effect April 1, 2023, and until further revision by the CPUC using its resolution process. ¹⁴ The surcharge rate was subsequently reduced from \$1.11 to \$0.90 pursuant to Resolution T-17818, which was issued on April 3, 2025, and became effective on May 1, 2025. The collected surcharge revenue is to be distributed among the PPPs as presented in Table 7.

Served and Unserved Areas of the State

Pub. Util. Code section 281 defines an unserved household as one for which no facility-based provider offers broadband service at speeds of at least 25 Megabits per second (Mbps) download and 3 Mbps upload (25/3 Mbps). Only unserved locations are eligible for CASF Infrastructure grants. The latest data available, as of December 31, 2023, indicates that 97.49 percent of California households have access to fixed (wireline and fixed wireless) broadband service at speeds of 25/3 Mbps and above.

97.49 percent of California households have access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband service at 25/3 Mbps or above as of December 2023.

In previous years, the data were collected at the census block level, but beginning in 2022, the CPUC is collecting location level deployment and subscription data to determine the served status of individual broadband serviceable locations, rather than census blocks. The CPUC has been increasing efforts to verify the accuracy of broadband deployment and subscriber data from providers. The collected broadband deployment data are processed, validated, and mapped on the CPUC's California Interactive Broadband Map available at https://www.broadbandmap.ca.gov/.

Broadband Availability in Rural and Urban Areas of the State

Table 9 below provides percentages of served and unserved households in California using 2020 Census urban/rural designation. It shows that 86.64 percent of rural households have access to broadband at or above 25/3 Mbps speeds, whereas 98.32 percent of households in urban areas have access at or above 25/3 Mbps. The data show that the Digital Divide between rural and urban areas widens as broadband speeds increase.

Progress in Meeting Broadband Deployment Goals

Table 10 below provides percentages of served and unserved households for each Consortia region in California. The numbers reflect all terrestrial broadband service as of December 31, 2023, using broadband availability data from the Federal Communication Commission's (FCC) National Broadband Map. Served households receive broadband speeds of at least 25/3 Mbps or above, while unserved households receive speeds less than 25/3 Mbps. Priority unserved households receive speeds less than 10/1 Mbps. "Households" are based on the FCC Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric data as of December 31, 2023. However, the FCC uses the term "units", instead of households. The FCC fabric does not count how many households there are within a unit, or at a broadband serviceable location. As such, the data presented here includes broadband availability at a location level, inclusive of households.

The table shows that there are 12 Consortia regions where less than 98 percent of households have access to broadband at or above 25/3 Mbps, whereas five Consortia regions show as having more than 98 percent of households with access to broadband at or above 25/3 Mbps.

The table does not show Tahoe Basin Consortia because it is located within Placer and El Dorado County and nested within the Gold Country Consortia. While the FCC is continuing to improve the quality of the data it collects, the FCC National Broadband Map relies on provider data and sometimes reflects higher levels of coverage and speeds than what is actually deployed. The CPUC continues to utilize the FCC availability data due to its regular update intervals and data granularity.

Broadband Adoption Levels

Broadband adoption measures the number of subscribers across the state with access to broadband service. Table 11 below provides broadband adoption levels for each California county as of December 31, 2023. The subscription data collected from ISPs at the address level is aggregated to the county level for the purposes of displaying adoption of broadband service. ISPs report adoption levels to the CPUC as part of their annual Broadband Data Collection submissions as consumer connections¹⁶, instead of households.

Pursuant to Pub. Util. Code sections 281 (b)(4), 281.6 and 5895, the CPUC is authorized to collect information from broadband service providers. Granular data at an address level for broadband deployment, adoption, and affordability provides a closer representation on the level of broadband service Californians have. The CPUC instituted a more granular data collection from broadband providers in order to identify locations served at the address level.

Map 2 depicts broadband adoption by county at minimum speeds of 25/3 Mbps as of December 31, 2023.



Broadband Infrastructure Grant Account

A. Infrastructure Grants in 2024

In 2024, the CPUC approved five Infrastructure grants in the amount of \$46,624,124 to provide broadband access to 3,122 eligible households in the counties of Fresno, Los Angeles, Monterey, Orange, Riverside, San Benito, San Diego, San Mateo, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara and Santa Cruz. All five projects will make significant steps towards closing California's digital divide by bringing highspeed broadband internet access at up to 1 Gigabit per second (Gbps) symmetrical (upload and download) speeds to unserved households. Two projects will also build open-access middle mile with connection speeds up to 10 Gbps to complement the Statewide Middle-Mile Network. All five projects will serve primarily low-income and historically disadvantaged communities and enable critical access to health, education and safety services, including enhanced

emergency communications for our first responders. The largest projects, Cruzio's Equal Access Summits to the Sea Project and LCB's Aromas-San Juan Project, are in Tier 2 - Elevated and Tier 3 - Extreme fire-threat zones and will enhance public safety by utilizing fixed wireless technology and underground fiber with less exposure to extreme weather events that can cause wildfires. In addition, Cruzio is partnering with the ALERTWildfire Consortium to host wildfire detection cameras on its wireless nodes supported by backup power. Similarly, Kwikbit's Mobile Home Park 1 Project will employ innovative 60 Ghz radio technology to reach low-income customers with minimal structural impact. The Aromas-San Juan Project also will provide critical educational access to communities where nearly 50 percent of students qualify for the federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program.

B. Infrastructure Funds Expended in 2024 and Expected Benefits

The CPUC made approximately \$27.85 million in payments in 2024 for 18 approved infrastructure projects. The following table lists the payments made for specific projects. The expected benefits of funds expended in 2024 can be expressed as the number of households that will have access to broadband. An estimated 6,330 households will have access to broadband from the payments to projects that are listed in Table 12.

C. Total Infrastructure Projects Awarded Since 2008

The CPUC has awarded \$344,621,327 to fund 100 broadband infrastructure projects (not including 44 withdrawn and rescinded projects totaling approximately \$168 million) since the beginning of the program in 2008 through December 31, 2024. The 100 completed and active projects include last-mile, hybrid and middle-mile projects that provide (or will provide) broadband access to an estimated 322,682 potential households.¹⁷



1. Project Subscriptions as of December 31, 2024

The CPUC is required to report the number of formerly unserved households that subscribed to broadband in CASF project areas.¹⁹ The CPUC collects this information through annual data requests to Infrastructure Account grantees for all last-mile and hybrid projects. Altogether, the provided data indicated that as of December 31, 2024, there were a total of 36,827 households who signed up for broadband services provided by 79 completed CASF projects. Attachment A provides the household subscriptions (both projected and actual) for each completed last-mile or hybrid project as well as project funding and status.

2. Cost per Household as of December 31, 2024

The CPUC is required to report the cost per household for each infrastructure project. Attachment A provides the cost per household for each project as of December 31, 2024. The table below shows the average cost per household for all approved lastmile, middle-mile, and hybrid projects. The cost per household is calculated by dividing the total amount awarded by the total estimated potential households in the project. However, this amount does not reflect the full cost of connecting a household as the CASF awards did not subsidize 100 percent of project costs prior to the passage of AB 1665 in 2017.

D. Rural Digital Opportunity Fund

Pub. Util. Code, section 914.7 (m) requires the CPUC to provide "[a]dditional details on efforts to leverage non-California Advanced Services Fund monies." In 2021, the CPUC published rules for the CASF-Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) "Kicker" Funding Initiative and the "Nearby" RDOF-Funded Project Initiative in D.21-01-003. The Decision also set program rules and solicited applications for CASF funding to supplement up to \$2 billion under the FCC's Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) program. The CPUC did not provide any CASF-RDOF grants in 2024. The CPUC made payments totaling \$200,083 to the RDOF-funded project, Connect Anza Phase III, in 2024. Connect Anza Phase III is expected to be completed in 2025.

E. Line Extension Program

The Line Extension Program (LEP) is a program within the Broadband Infrastructure Grant Account that subsidizes the cost of connecting an individual household or property to an existing or proposed facility-based broadband provider.²² The program was established by AB 1665, which provided a total funding allocation of \$5 million and was implemented by Decision 19-04-022. Staff have been working on revising LEP rules which are now undergoing public review. As such, the CPUC did not approve funding for any projects in 2024. Work was done on one LEP project totaling \$1,770,748 which will provide access to broadband infrastructure to 194 unserved households in Hollister, California.

In January 2023, staff provided ministerial approval for a LEP grant to extend service to a low-income resident's home in Grass Valley in the amount of \$2,575. Comcast Corporation, the service provider, completed the project on March 11, 2024.

On August 31, 2023, the CPUC approved LEP funding to South Valley Internet, to construct the South Valley Road Project to bring broadband at speeds of 1 Gigabit per second (Gbps) symmetrical (download and upload) to 194 households serving 740 residents, including 130 school-aged children currently enrolled in the public school system.

The following table provides details on all LEP grants awarded as of December 31, 2024.

F. Infrastructure Account Benefits

CASF Infrastructure Account grantees were asked to report data on job creation and socioeconomic benefits related to 100 of their associated projects.²³ The Infrastructure Account received data responses for 94 of the projects²⁴ in response to questions related to job creation. The grantees reported that 40% of their projects aimed to create jobs and 22% of their projects plan to stimulate additional job creation initiatives. Regarding the socioeconomic benefits of their projects, the percentages of grantees that assisted customers with access to various services are as follows:

- Educational Resources 63%
- Health Services 63%
- Government Services 63%
- Secure Access to Internet 59%
- Connect to others through the Internet 58%
- Health Services 63% of grantees noted that they assisted customers with gaining access to remote health services through improved broadband access.

These responses highlight the significant role of CASF grantees in providing essential resources and fostering connections within communities.

Rural and Urban Regional Broadband Consortia Grant Account

The Consortia Account provides grants to eligible consortia to facilitate broadband deployment by assisting CASF infrastructure grant applicants in the project development or grant application process or assisting broadband deployment projects related to programs created under SB 156 and AB 164. On May 19, 2022, the CPUC adopted D.22-05-029, which made programmatic changes to the Consortia Account including allocating \$10.71 million in funding for FY 2023-24. The Decision also modified Consortia Account rules, including expansion of allowable consortia activities, increasing the annual maximum funding cap, and clarifying consortia regional boundary requirements.

Since the account's inception, the CPUC has awarded consortia grants in six solicitations - in 2011, 2016, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022. Map 1 of this report illustrates the distribution of the 16 consortia regions both currently and previously funded by county.²⁷

The CASF funds the following consortia activities consistent with Pub. Util. Code section 281:

- Collaborating with the CPUC and other state agencies to engage regional consortia, local officials, internet service providers, stakeholders, and consumers regarding priority areas and cost-effective strategies to achieve the broadband access goal.
- Identifying potential CASF infrastructure projects or potential broadband deployment projects related to new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164, along with other opportunities, where providers can expand and improve their infrastructure and service offerings to achieve the goal of reaching 98 percent broadband deployment in each consortia region.
- Assisting potential CASF infrastructure applicants or potential applicants for broadband deployment projects related to the new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164 in the project development or grant application process.

- Conducting activities that will lead to or that can be reasonably expected to lead to CASF infrastructure
 projects or broadband deployment projects related to new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164,
 including but not limited to the following examples of allowable activities:
 - » Supporting project permitting activities.
 - » Engaging local government officials and communities to better understand and explain regional broadband needs and solutions and providing technical assistance to such entities.
 - » Conducting an inventory of public assets (e.g., rights-of-ways, publicly owned towers, public utility poles, equipment housing, publicly owned property) and aggregate demand, including speed tests and the identification and updates of priority areas.
- Assisting the CPUC in publicizing requests for wireline testing volunteers in areas, as needed.
- Assisting the CPUC in promoting broadband deployment in California, related to the Federal Funding Account and other programs including Middle-Mile, Broadband Loan Loss Reserve, and Local Agency Technical Assistance created under SB 156 and AB 164.

A. Consortia Grants Approved in 2023

On June 1, 2022, the CPUC released a new solicitation to accept applications that would represent all regions in California starting in January 2023. From this solicitation, the CPUC approved fifteen applications for \$10,333,173 in total funding in Resolution T-17778.²⁸

The following table provides a list of these 15 approved grants.

B. Consortia Funds Expended in 2024

The CPUC disbursed \$1.66 million to the consortia in calendar year (CY) 2024. The following table shows payments made to consortia in 2024 and total cumulative payments, as of December 31, 2024. Central Sierra Connect Consortium, East Bay Broadband Consortium, Eastern Sierra Connect Consortium, Los Angeles County Regional Broadband Consortium, and Northeast California Connect Consortium were previously awarded grantees and did not receive awards during the 2023 cycle. San Joaquin Valley Regional Broadband Consortium experienced staff turnover which resulted in a delay to payment disbursement during 2024.

C. Consortia Account Benefits

For awards granted in 2023, the disbursements to consortia groups were for the following activities:

- Collaborating with the CPUC, and other state agencies to engage regional consortia, local officials, ISPs, stakeholders, and consumers regarding priority areas and cost-effective strategies to achieve the broadband access goal.
- Identifying potential CASF infrastructure projects or potential broadband deployment projects related to new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164, along with other opportunities, where ISPs can expand and improve their infrastructure and service offerings to achieve the goal of reaching 98% broadband deployment in each consortia region.
- Assisting potential CASF infrastructure applicants or potential applicants for broadband deployment projects related to the new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164 in the project development or grant application process.
- Conducting activities that will lead to or that can be reasonably expected to lead to CASF infrastructure
 projects or broadband deployment projects related to new programs created under SB 156 and AB 164,
 including the Federal Funding Account, Middle-Mile, Broadband Loan Loss Reserve, and Local Agency
 Technical Assistance.
- Assisting the CPUC in publicizing requests for wireline testing volunteers in areas, as needed.

To assess the Consortia Account output, staff sent consortia grantees a data request on December 17, 2024, requesting information about outcomes of consortia deployment efforts in 2024. The following provides a summary of the responses.

12 active consortia grantees responded detailing their efforts in deployment, as shown in Attachment B. The following are common themes related to those deployment efforts:

- Collaboration & Strategy Work with state agencies, local officials, ISPs, and stakeholders to identify priority areas and cost-effective broadband deployment strategies.
- Project Identification Identify potential broadband infrastructure projects and opportunities under CASF, SB 156, and AB 164 to expand ISP service offerings and reach 98% deployment.
- Application & Funding Support Assist broadband project applicants with development and grant application processes for state and federal funding programs.
- Implementation & Public Engagement Facilitate activities leading to broadband deployment, including outreach for wireline testing volunteers and promoting related funding programs.

Consortia Account Performance Metrics

Grantees were asked to report data on job creation and socioeconomic benefits related to their associated projects.²⁹ The Consortia Account received twelve complete data request submissions. Of the submissions, 50% reported that their projects aimed to create jobs. In relation to job creation, 40% of grantees have future plans to stimulate additional job creation initiatives. Additionally, grantees were asked about the socioeconomic benefits of their projects. Of the submissions, 80% helped participants access educational resources, 70% helped participants access health services, 80% helped participants access government services, 80% helped participants access the Internet securely, and 70% helped participants to connect to others through the Internet.

A. Total Consortia Grants Awarded Since Inception

As of December 31, 2024, the Consortia Account has awarded approximately \$29.10 million since its inception.³² In addition, the CPUC hosted a regional consortia learning community summit on April 20, 2023 and CASF public workshops on April 29, 2024. Broadband Adoption Account

Eligible applicants for the Adoption Account are local governments, senior centers, schools, public libraries, nonprofit organizations, including nonprofit religious organizations, and community- based organizations with programs to increase publicly available or after-school broadband access and digital inclusion, such as digital literacy training programs.

The Adoption Account approved 106 projects in 2024, awarding approximately \$15.52 million in total grant funding.

The Adoption Account provides funding for two types of projects:

- Digital Inclusion: Projects providing digital literacy training and public education to communities with limited broadband adoption including low-income communities, senior communities, and communities facing socioeconomic barriers to broadband adoption.
- Broadband Access: Projects providing free broadband access in community training rooms or other public space, such as local government centers, senior centers, schools, public libraries, non-profit organizations, and community-based organizations, as well as funding community outreach, such as analysis, comparison of internet plans and call centers that will increase broadband access and adoption.

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025, the Commission issued Resolution T-17825 which set an appropriation amount of \$36.39 million for the Adoption Account.

A. Adoption Grants Awarded in 2024

In 2024, the CPUC approved via ministerial review 94 projects submitted in the January and July 2024 application windows. Of the 94 grants approved, 94 were accepted. Additionally, the CPUC approved three projects submitted in the January and July 2024 application windows via resolution.³³ Of the three grants approved, three were accepted.

Altogether, 97 grants were approved and accepted, totaling \$11,006,616 in funding as shown in Table 20 below.

B. Adoption Account Funds Allocated and Expended in 2024

C. Adoption Account Benefits

The Adoption Account benefits can be expressed as the number of people receiving training from digital literacy projects and the number of people receiving broadband access through the broadband access projects. Staff sent grantees data requests to identify the number of people who have benefited from projects. A summary of the data collected is provided below. These numbers will continue to increase as most of the projects are still in progress.

- **Digital Literacy:** 45,807 people completed eight hours or more of digital literacy training and 4,250 new broadband subscriptions from the 427 in progress or completed projects awarded as of December 31, 2024.
- **Broadband Access:** 126,438 people were provided broadband access and 13,149 new broadband subscriptions from the 43 in progress or completed projects awarded as of December 31, 2024. Additionally, 13,249 students were provided computing devices in school and school districts in response to the COVID-19 pandemic (Resolution T-17697, issued May 12, 2020).

• **Broadband Call Center:** 14,080 new broadband subscriptions resulted from 27 in progress or completed projects awarded as of December 31, 2024.

Grantees were also asked about job creation and, more generally, socioeconomic benefits. Out of the responses for 168 projects, approximately 12% responded that the project aimed to create jobs. ³⁴ Grantees reported that 127 jobs were created due to funded activities out of a projected 29 jobs. Although a low number of projects had a specific goal to create jobs, approximately 64% reported providing training programs to enhance workforce skills.

Grantees were also asked about socioeconomic benefits for their funded projects. Of the 168 projects for which responses were provided, 99% helped participants access educational resources, 91% helped participants access health services, 98% helped participants access government services, 100% helped participants access the Internet securely, and 99% helped participants connect to others through the Internet.

D. Total Adoption Account Projects Awarded

Since CASF's Adoption Account inception in 2017 through December 31, 2024, the CPUC has approved a total of 427 Adoption Account digital literacy projects, 43 Adoption Account broadband access projects, and 27 call center projects throughout California. Of the digital literacy projects approved, 130 are completed and 297 are in progress. Of the 43 broadband access projects approved, 29 are completed and 14 are in progress. Of the 27 call center projects approved, 6 are completed and 21 are in progress.

Broadband Public Housing Account

The Public Housing Account provides grants and loans to build broadband networks offering free broadband service for residents of low-income communities. SB 156 revised the Public Housing Account to provide grants and loans to finance projects to connect broadband networks offering free broadband service for residents of low-income communities including but not limited to, publicly supported housing developments, farmworker housing, and other housing developments or mobile home parks with low-income residents, as determined by the CPUC.

The CPUC implemented programmatic changes to the Public Housing Account resulting from SB 156 in D.24-03-041 such as changes for publicly supported housing developments including farmworker housing, Tribal Housing and other low-income housing developments. In 2023, in Rulemaking R.20-08-021, the CPUC issued a Staff Proposal proposing modifications to the Public Housing Account rules and guidelines. On March 7, 2024, the Commission issued D.24-03-041 which implemented additional changes to the Public Housing Account including expanding eligibility for non-publicly supported housing developments and for project costs to facilitate deployment of broadband networks in low-

income communities that lack access to free broadband service that meets state standards. Today, eligible entities that can receive awards from the Public Housing Account include mobile home parks with low-income residents.

Projects funded after March 2024 are subject to the rules and guidelines adopted in D.24-03-041. For FY 2024-2025, the CPUC issued Resolution T-17825 which allocated \$30.14 million for the Public Housing Account.

The following sections detail the Public Housing Account grants awarded and funds expended in 2024.

A. Public Housing Grants Awarded in 2024

In 2024, the CPUC held two application cycles for the Public Housing Account and received 57 applications. Of the 57 applications, 12 applications were withdrawn. The table below highlights the 45 applications that were approved in 2024.

C. Public Housing Account Benefits

1. Infrastructure Projects

Prior to D.22-05-029, the 307 completed infrastructure projects (out of 318 awarded) provide free broadband connectivity to 20,443 public housing units, at an average cost of \$422 per housing unit. These completed projects are expected to provide residents with internet service speeds of at least 6 Mbps downstream and 1.5 Mbps upstream.

Projects approved under the rules in D.22-05-029, increased the standard for broadband internet to 25 Mbps downstream, 3 Mbps upstream per the FCC's guidelines at the time of publication.

The Public Housing Account subsidizes project costs for inside wiring installation and equipment required for inside network (both wired and wireless) construction; maintenance or operational costs such as the ongoing cost of an ISP circuit are not subsidized.

In March of 2024, the FCC increased its benchmark definition for Broadband speeds to be 100 Mbps downstream and 20 Mbps downstream. The rules in D.24-03-041, also issued in March of 2024, tied the Broadband Public Housing Account's speed requirements to the FCC broadband definition.

In 2024, 20 completed infrastructure projects approved under the rules adopted in D.22-05-029 (out of 56 awarded from 2022 and 2023) provide free broadband connectivity to 869 public housing units, at an average cost of \$1,308.79 per housing unit.

2. Adoption Projects

The table below summarizes previously funded Public Housing Account adoption project participation and costs. The 117 completed adoption projects (out of 121 awarded) provided digital literacy training to 5,741 public housing residents (the total resident population for all completed project locations is 26,611). The total average cost is \$583.39 per resident trained. Grantees are required to provide project outcomes including the number of residents trained and the number of residents trained who subscribe to broadband. Of those who completed the digital literacy training, 86 percent subscribe to broadband.

3. Data Request

In an effort to gather information on the socioeconomic benefits of funded projects, grantees were requested to respond to a data request to provide information related to the impact of their funded project. Grantees were asked if their residents had been impacted in any of the following ways:³⁶

- Increasing employment prospects
- Accessing educational resources
- Accessing health services
- Accessing government services
- Accessing the Internet securely
- Learning how to connect to others.

Staff sent out data requests to 60 past grantees across 532 projects and received 13 responses which represented a total of 98 projects.


Grantees were asked about job creation and, more generally, socioeconomic benefits. Out of the responses for 98 projects, approximately 3% responded that the project aimed to create jobs. Grantees reported that 10 jobs were created due to funded activities. Twenty-five percent reported that training programs were provided to enhance workforce skills.

Grantees were also asked about socioeconomic benefits for their funded projects. Of the 98 projects for which responses were provided, 73% helped participants access educational resources, 75% helped participants access health services, 73% helped participants access government services, 82% helped participants access the Internet securely, and 55% helped participants connect to others through the Internet.

D. Total Public Housing Account Projects Awarded

Since 2015, the CPUC has approved a total of 418 Public Housing Account infrastructure projects and 121 Public Housing Account adoption projects throughout California. ^{37,38} Of the 418 infrastructure projects approved, 318 were approved in the application cycles between 2015 and 2022. Of the 318 infrastructure projects approved, 307 are completed and 11 are in progress (these projects were delayed due to the COVID-19 safety restrictions). Of the 121 adoption projects approved, 117 are completed and 4 are in progress. The projects in progress were often paused and picked up again due to COVID-19 safety restrictions as common areas used for on-site instruction closed and some projects have had to shift to virtual training methods.

On May 19, 2022, the Commission issued Decision (D.) 22-05-029 which implemented changes to the Public Housing Account enacted by SB 156 and programmatic changes for publicly supported housing developments including farmworker housing, and allocated \$15 million funding for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

The rules implemented in (D.) 22-05-029 were in place through the January 2024 round of BPHA applications.

³⁹ Prior to SB 156, from the program's inception in 2015 through 2021, the Public Housing Account provided grants for broadband connectivity and adoption in publicly supported communities (PSCs). During this period, eligible applicants were limited to PSCs that are wholly owned by a public housing agency or an incorporated non-profit organization (501(c)(3)s that have received public funding to subsidize housing construction or maintenance costs of housing occupied by residents whose annual income qualifies as "low" or "very low" according to federal poverty guidelines. \$20 million in grant funding was available to finance infrastructure projects and \$5 million was available to finance broadband adoption projects for residents in PSCs. Broadband Adoption projects in public housing are no longer funded through the Public Hosing Account but can be funded through the adoption Account.

Tribal Technical Assistance Grant Program

The CPUC Tribal Technical Assistance program was adopted in D.20-08-005 and updated in D.24-03-041. The Tribal Technical Assistance program provides grants to California Tribes, with or without federal recognition, to pursue improved voice and broadband communications. The Tribal Technical

The Tribal Technical Assistance Grant Program approved 7 projects in 2024 awarding approximately \$1.47 million in total grant funding.

Assistance program initially authorized up to \$5,000,000 in CASF until funds are replenished and/or exhausted. The program was allocated up to an additional \$2,300,000 for FY 2023-24.

On March 7, 2024, the CPUC issued D.24-03-041 modifying the Tribal Technical Assistance Program to align with the Local Agency Technical Assistance Program rules and guidelines. The Decision increased the \$150,000 per FY per tribe grant amount to \$250,000 and expanded eligible program activities. Projects funded after March 2024 are subject to the rules and guidelines adopted in D.24-03-041.

Eligible applicants, under the 2024 program rules and guidelines, can request funding for the following types of technical assistance, including but not limited to:

- Feasibility Studies;
- Market Studies;
- Needs Assessments;
- Broadband Deployment-Related Grant Writing; and/or,
- Business Plans

A. Tribal Technical Assistance Grants Awarded

The CPUC awarded 7 grants to 6 Tribes totaling approximately \$1,471,900 for feasibility studies, market studies, and business plans in 2024. Since the program's inception, 74 grants have been awarded to 39 Tribes for a total funding allocation of approximately \$7,291,650.

1. Tribal Technical Assistance Program Benefits

These grants were designed to advance the goals of Pub. Util. Code section 281 by providing technical assistance to California Tribes to develop market studies, feasibilities studies, and/or business plans which support Tribes in their pursuit of improved communications. Each approved applicant has attested to advancing the CASF program goals and other program criteria as specified in D.20-08-005 and D.24-03-041.

- Actively participated in county and regional broadband working groups, advocating for broadband policies and expansion strategies.
- Attended quarterly state broadband meetings and provided debriefs to stakeholders and local jurisdictions, covering key updates from CPUC, Broadband for All Commission, MMAC, and CDT.

8. Los Angeles Digital Equity Action League Consortium (LA DEAL)

- LA DEAL convened 9 meetings with CDT and CPUC to discuss the development and modification to the MMBI in LA County, and to explore opportunities to connect the agencies with local partners for public-public partnerships (e.g., promoting the state's market sounding process).
- LA DEAL hosted 7 Stewardship meetings in 2024 to discuss priority areas for LA County, working to identify opportunities to leverage state resources to streamline connectivity standards locally and maximize infrastructure funds, such as the Federal Funding Account and CASF Infrastructure Deployment grant programs, for developing regional projects. Additionally, the discussions stressed incorporating community input to shape strategies, piloting localized solutions, boosting diverse outreach and engagement, and ensuring participation by directly impacted groups.

- LA DEAL coordinated or participated in at least 7 infrastructure meetings with over 30 municipal and community stakeholders during this reporting period.
- Hosted a Loan Loss Reserve Fund Briefing on March 7th with the California Public Utilities Commission LLRF team to provide an overview of the program and encourage local municipalities to apply to help fund their local infrastructure projects. The focus was on increasing awareness of the LLRF program to assist local governments with funding infrastructure buildout, and providing guidance on technical assistance with the application process. On May 29, 2024, we hosted an infrastructure task force meeting with our LA County ISP Convening to identify infrastructure gaps and permitting opportunities for the region. We also gathered for an infrastructure taskforce with the SGVCOG, the infrastructure committee, Public Works on 7/15/2024.
- LA DEAL identified the following 7 priority unserved and underserved areas based on ACS data and meetings with partners in alignment with and guidance from County partners and stewardship committee members: South LA, East LA/Boyle Heights, Pacoima/San Fernando Valley, Antelope Valley, Gateway Cities region, 110 Corridor, Alameda Corridor.

- The City of LA broke ground on a project in Boyle Heights. LA DEAL also coordinated with Magellan Advisors, Gateway Cities Council of Government, and San Gabriel Valley Council of Government for regular check-ins following the state's release of updated MMBI maps that show significantly reduced route miles through their region and other parts of LA County. The meetings allowed our stakeholders to compare the initial and revised infrastructure routes and facilitate evaluating the shifting efficacy of state middle mile deployment plans to bridge digital divides for marginalized Gateway Cities residents.

- LA DEAL identified at least 5 areas that could benefit from leveraged public assets: Cities of Los Angeles (Bureau of Street Lighting), Long Beach, West Hollywood, Pasadena and Bell Gardens provided us with their digital equity plans and RFPs.
- LA DEAL additionally coordinated with Entrust Solutions and the San Gabriel Valley Council of
 Government on the San Gabriel Valley Broadband Regional Opportunities and Resources forum on
 March 13 to discuss collaboration opportunities and resources for broadband development in the San
 Gabriel Valley. The LA DEAL team helped to invite local non-profit organizations working on
 broadband development and planning to learn more about broadband services in the San Gabriel Valley
 and discuss the Council of Government's broadband goals.

11. Southern Border Broadband Consortium (SBBC)

• In 2024, the SBBC actively participated in planning meetings and community forums to advocate for broadband infrastructure improvements across the region. They collaborated with internet service providers (ISPs) such as AT&T, T-Mobile, and Frontier to address the challenges of servicing rural areas, particularly in the northern parts of the county where ISPs are less prevalent. Discussions focused on developing solutions to connect underserved communities and highlighted the benefits of long-term investment in key areas like Niland, Calipatria, and Bombay Beach, which are poised for growth due to projects in lithium extraction, geothermal energy, and data centers. Projections of household and business growth were also shared.

- SBBC regularly attended meetings with the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) on the Regional Digital Infrastructure Taskforce (ReDIT), SoCal Transformational, and CETF's Digital Equity initiatives. These sessions facilitated partnerships to align broadband updates and project sharing. Additionally, best practices for permitting and construction were discussed to achieve shared goals.
- Using survey data, SBBC created reports on priority areas for broadband deployment, which were used
 in discussions with ISPs and regional partners. The organization also engaged in frequent meetings with
 county offices of education, the Imperial Valley Telecommunications Authority, and local governments
 to improve community awareness of BEAD planning. These efforts targeted residential areas, lowincome neighborhoods, underfunded school districts, and areas lacking healthcare facilities, including
 Salton City, Niland, Calipatria, Ocotillo, Borrego Springs, Julian, and Seeley.
- In collaboration with AT&T, Human IT, the Imperial Regional Alliance, and the Imperial Valley Economic Development Corporation, SBBC hosted a successful event where 200 laptops were distributed to those in need, ranging from students to elderly residents. Free digital literacy programs and technical assistance were provided alongside the laptops, further strengthening SBBC's relationship with AT&T for future community projects.
- SBBC also hosted sessions for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) in both the Imperial Valley and San Diego regions. Through regular meetings, effective marketing practices, including flyer distribution and newsletters, were shared to increase enrollment. SBBC's efforts resulted in exceeding the enrollment target in the Imperial Valley, leading the region to be one of the highest achievers in ACP signups statewide by the program's conclusion in February.

12. Tahoe Basin Project

- The Tahoe Prosperity Center (TPC) has effectively coordinated regional collaboration through consistent mapping protocols with the CPUC while successfully working with South Lake Tahoe on Policy J-4 and maintaining productive relationships with Placer and El Dorado Counties.
- TPC has developed useful GIS-based mapping systems and asset inventories that help identify potential CASF infrastructure projects, while thoughtfully incorporating "dig once" opportunities to address the region's unique terrain.
- The organization has provided reliable support for infrastructure applications by offering technical
 assistance, helping identify match funding opportunities, and developing practical strategies for the
 Tahoe Basin region.
- TPC has maintained a systematic approach to public asset inventory and community engagement, including regular documentation of rights-of-way, towers, and utility poles, while fostering productive relationships with local government officials.
- Through consistent communication with the Commission and stakeholders regarding broadband needs and opportunities, TPC has helped ensure reliable data collection and reporting for the region.
- The Tahoe Prosperity Center actively coordinates multiple funding sources, including our federal USDA
 Broadband Technical Assistance grant and support from our five county partners, to complement CASF
 activities. This approach helps maximize resources and strengthen broadband deployment efforts across
 the region.
