Public Comment

- Modifies the settlement in the same ways as the Proposed Decision (PD), except that rebates for multi-unit dwellings are increased from 25% in the PD to 50% in the alternate.
- Closes the proceeding.

• Safety is an important issue for the Commission. Safety considerations were included in the scope of the proceeding and are reflected in the terms of the Proposed Settlement which are adopted in this decision along with additional safety requirements.

ESTIMATED COST:

• \$22 million in recovered costs from ratepayers.

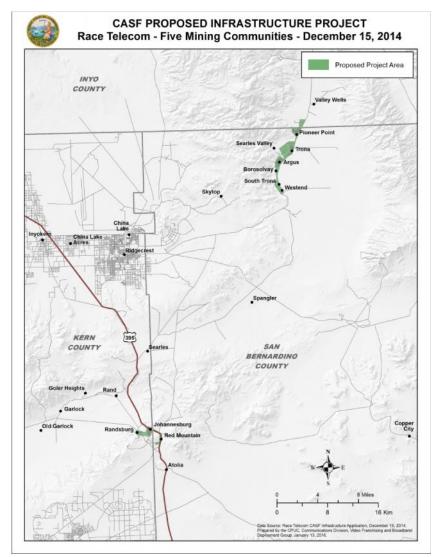

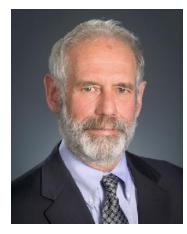
