PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Authorizes the expansion of the on-bill financing programs for non residential customers administered by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas), and San Diego Gas & Electric Company to support clean energy technologies beyond energy efficiency.
- Approves the proposal of the California Alternative Energy and Advanced Transportation Financing Authority (CAEATFA) to expand the clean energy technologies eligible under the California Hub for Energy Efficiency Financing programs.
- Denies SoCalGas' proposal to offer an on-bill financing program for residential customers; CAEATFA's request for reauthorization for the Municipal Government, School, Hospital, and Large Commercial financing program; and the Local Government Sustainable Energy Coalition's proposal to create a new decarbonization incentive rate.
- Directs further record development regarding Tariff On-Bill proposals for residential customers.

Ratesetting

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Adopts the uncontested partial settlement among Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), the Public Advocates Office
 at the California Public Utilities Commission, and The Utility Reform Network to recover \$720.717 million associated with
 costs primarily recorded in Wildfire Mitigation and Catastrophic Event memorandum and balancing accounts.
- Does not resolve PG&E's request to recover \$591.9 million in revenue requirement associated with costs recorded in the Vegetation Management Balancing Account, which remains in dispute.

The estimated cost of this decision is \$720.717 million.
