PROPOSED OUTCOME:

• Creates two California LifeLine pilot programs to leverage the federal Affordable Connectivity Program.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

ESTIMATED COST:

The estimated costs of this decision are unknown at this time. It is expected that the new pilot programs may
increase participation in California LifeLine, which would increase customer subsidy costs for California
LifeLine. The new pilot programs will accept enrolment until federal Affordable Connectivity Program funding
ends or two years after the date of the decision, whichever is sooner.

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

Approves grant funding in the amount of \$951,068.94 from the California Advanced Services Fund (CASF)
Broadband Public Housing Account (BPHA) for 14 projects from five applicants. These 14 projects will deploy
both wireless and wired broadband infrastructure utilizing wi-fi and copper technologies capable of 25
Megabits per second (Mbps) download and 3 Mbps upload for 830 living units in these publicly supported
housing developments.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

• The deployment of broadband in public housing for the purpose of offering free internet access to those who do not already have access to a free broadband network will improve public safety by providing enhanced access to government, e-health, and online education opportunities.

\$951,068.94.
