PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Adopts Park Water (PW) Revenue Requirement (RR) of \$42.1 million for Test Year (TY) 2025 and a total RR of \$149 million for the TY and attrition years.
- Adopts Apple Valley Ranchos (AVR) Water RR of \$32 million for Test Year (TY) 2025 and a total RR of \$102 million for the TY and attrition years.
- Closes the consolidated proceedings.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- Will permit company to earn a reasonable revenue to provide safe and reliable drinking water in PW and AVR Water service territories.

ESTIMATED COST:

- PW will have an annual increase in RR of \$5.96 million for TY 2025, \$1.74 million for 2026, and \$1.35 million for 2027.
- AVR will have an annual increase in RR of \$1.88 million for TY 2025, \$1.73 million for 2026 and \$1.72 million for 2027.

- Adopts Apple Valley Ranchos (AVR) Water RR of \$28.3 million for TY 2025, \$29.2 million for 2026, and \$30.0 million for 2027.
- Closes the consolidated proceedings.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- Will permit company to earn a reasonable revenue to provide safe and reliable drinking water in PW and AVR Water service territories.

ESTIMATED COST:

- PW will have an annual increase in RR of -\$0.30 million for TY 2025, \$0.81 million for 2026, and \$0.85 million for 2027.
- AVR will have an annual increase in RR of -\$2.39 million for TY 2025, \$0.74 million for 2026 and \$0.66 million for 2027.
